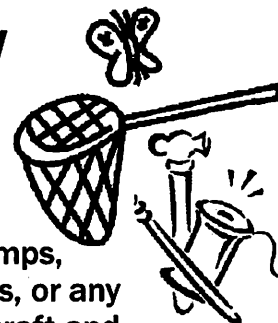

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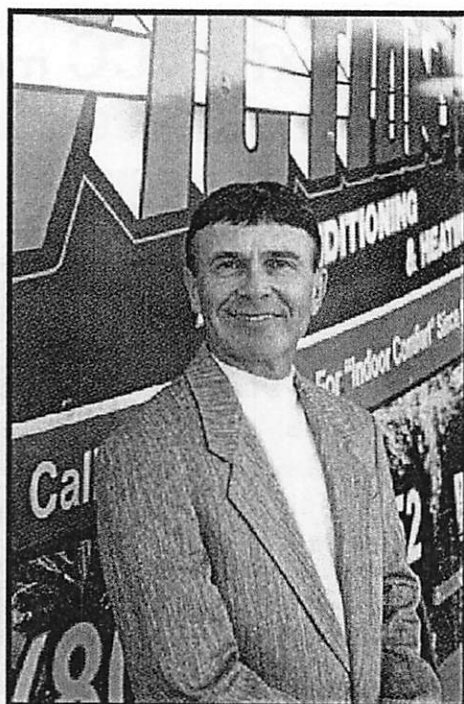

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HANDY HOUSEHOLD HINTS

1. To keep critters out of your yard and/or garden, sprinkle cayenne pepper. The cayenne pepper does not hurt the yard or garden, but most critters do not like it.
2. Newspaper weeds away: Plant your plants; work the nutrients into the soil. Then lay wet newspapers, put overlapping layers around the plants, cover with mulch, and forget the weeds. Weeds can get through some gardening plastic, but they shouldn't get through wet newspapers.
3. For small items dropped on the floor: place a nylon stocking over the end of the vacuum hose and start vacuuming. The stocking will keep the small item from getting sucked into the vacuum.
4. Heat leftover pizza in a nonstick skillet on the stovetop, on med-low until warm to keep the crust crispy.

MEMORIES - Remember Burma Shave signs?

They were used from the 1930s through the early 1950s. Before there were interstates, everyone drove on two-lane high-ways. Burma Shave signs were posted all over the countryside in fields. The small red signs with white letters were placed with five signs about 100 feet apart, each containing one line of a four-line couplet and the obligatory fifth sign advertising Burma Shave, a popular shaving cream of the time. Here are a few examples of hundreds.

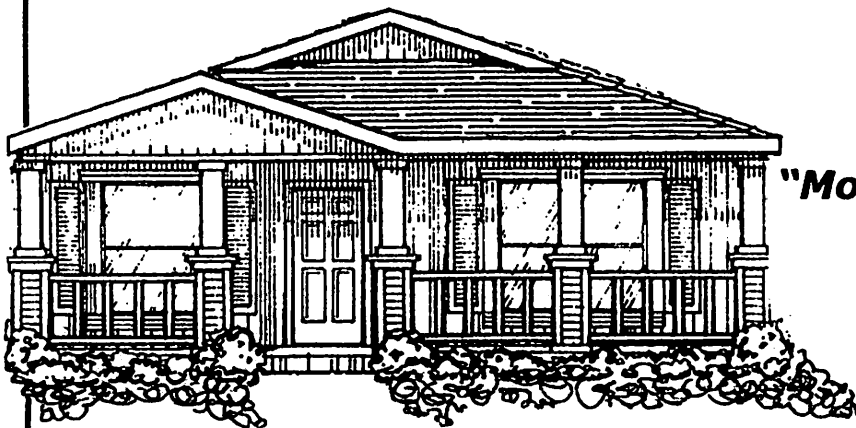

Joe reminded everyone to speak one at a time. Minutes from the meeting of 9 August 2012 were approved.

COMMITTEE REPORT: Block Captains

1. Joe reported that the packets will be ready for distribution next Thursday (9/20/12). He will distribute (the packets) to the block captains who will distribute to their blocks.
2. Block captains should write their name, space and phone numbers in each packet and announce that there are plans to discuss emergency preparedness at the November meeting. Bonnie will contact a potential speaker to see if he is available that day.

OLD BUSINESS:

1. Rummage sale: there were fewer participants than last time, but sales were adequate and KLCC made \$80.
2. Transportation: Ellen was contacted and her grandson provided a resident with a box-moving service for a reasonable fee. Thanks, Ellen, for your assistance.
3. Hobby Show and Sell/Tell date is OCT 6th in the front clubhouse from 9AM to 1PM.
 - a. Three people already signed up, plus three more signed up at this meeting.
 - b. There are 11 tables available; each person can have one table until all are assigned; others will need to bring their own table and anyone who needs a second table will need to bring their own.
4. Park street names: numerous suggestions were submitted; consensus appears to be that the purpose is to make it easy for visitors, vendors, and emergency vehicles to find residents. For this reason the four north-south streets will have either number-names, or basics like East/West/Main/ Front, and the 12 cross streets will probably be alphabetical using a theme such as gems or flowers, or something similar.
 - a. Committee will narrow options to 4-6 choices for voting in November or December. Members include Wendy, Ellen, Joe, and either Elise or Taylor since we need park manager approval for any names chosen. The committee meeting will be in 2 weeks (September 27). Joe will reserve the clubhouse or the room at the back pool.
5. The new logo was included in the August Connector newsletter and was well received. Thanks to Joleen for thinking of this and providing choices for members to vote upon last month.
6. The mystery about the men around the laundry room across from Space 91 was solved: they were waiting to do work in the park, which has been completed.

NEW BUSINESS:

1. Suggestion box items
 - a. Ellen suggested that Joleen put a notice in *The Connector* informing residents that there is a lost and found "closet" at the office. Please take found items there, and seek anything you may have lost by calling or stopping by during their hours. It would be helpful to post (the) office hours in *The Connector* as well.

SPEEDY LASAGNA

Prep: 15 min. Cook: 40 min;
Stand: 5 min. Yields: 6 servings



INGREDIENTS

1 pound Italian sausage, casings removed
1 (26-oz.) jar spaghetti sauce with onions and roasted garlic
1 tbsp chopped fresh or 1 tsp dried basil
½ tsp pepper 6 no-cook lasagna noodles
2 cups ricotta cheese
2 cups shredded mozzarella cheese
¾ cup grated Parmesan cheese

HELP YOUR DOG BE GOOD

Make your dog's life lively. Make sure he/she is getting sufficient physical and mental exercise every day. A tired dog is a good dog, and one who is less likely to bark from boredom or frustration. Depending on breed, age, and health, your dog may require several long walks each day as well as a good game of chasing the ball and playing with some interactive toys with you.



PREPARATION: Crumble sausage into a plastic colander; place over a large microwave-safe bowl. Microwave at HIGH for one minute, and stir. Microwave at HIGH for three to 3 1/2 minutes more, stirring every 30 seconds, or until sausage is done and no longer pink.

Drain well on paper towels. Stir together sausage, spaghetti sauce, basil, and pepper in large bowl. Spread one-third sausage mixture in bottom of a lightly greased 11- x-7-inch micro-wave-safe baking dish; top with three noodles, one cup ricotta cheese, and one cup mozzarella cheese. Repeat layers once.

Top evenly with remaining sausage mixture and grated Parmesan cheese. Cover with double-thickness plastic wrap, and microwave at 50% power for 30 to 35 minutes. Carefully lift one corner of plastic wrap to allow steam to escape, and let stand in microwave five minutes before serving.

USEFUL IDEA
