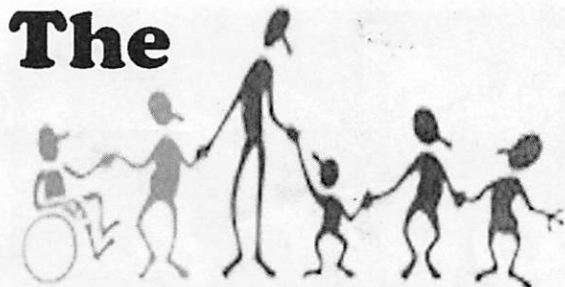

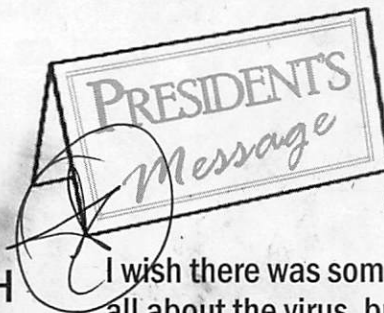

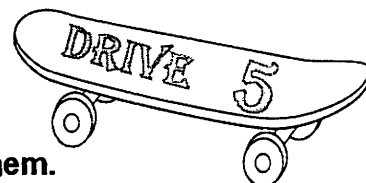

PLAN AHEAD FOR FIRE SEASON

The 2020 Wildfire Season is approaching San Diego. With weeds and wild grasses coming into maturity, and significant rain no longer expected this Spring, we need to make our homes as safe as possible.

While we Kearney Lodge Mobile Home Park residents cannot make clearances of 100 feet around our homes, we can clear our spaces of flammable material.

Weed and decorative grasses are drying out. Dead palm fronds, Bird-of-Paradise leaves and flower stalks, banana tree leaves, and dry yucca and other large succulent leaves, plus dead pine and other evergreen needles and leftover fall leaves are all highly flammable and make excellent tinder. You can probably think of other vulnerable materials on your space.

If you haven't already started, clear the weeds and dead plant material of your space. If your neighbors are unable and/or cannot afford to hire someone, perhaps you can help them.

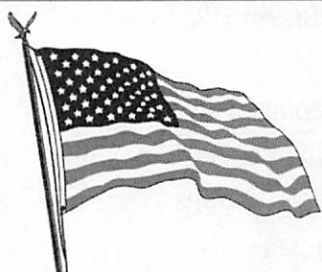
ARE YOU 60 OR OLDER?

Please take a moment of silence today and thank the many soldiers who fought and died for our country on D-Day.

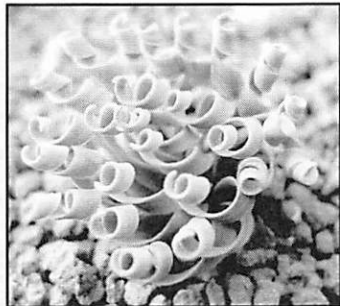
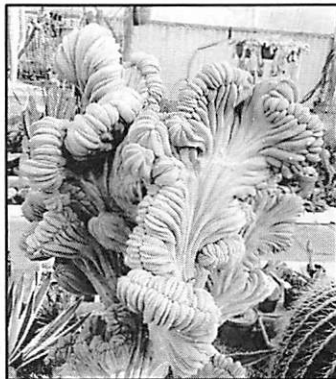

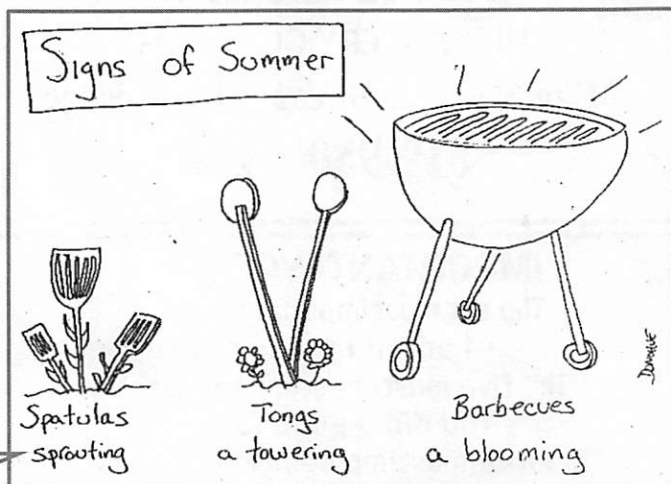
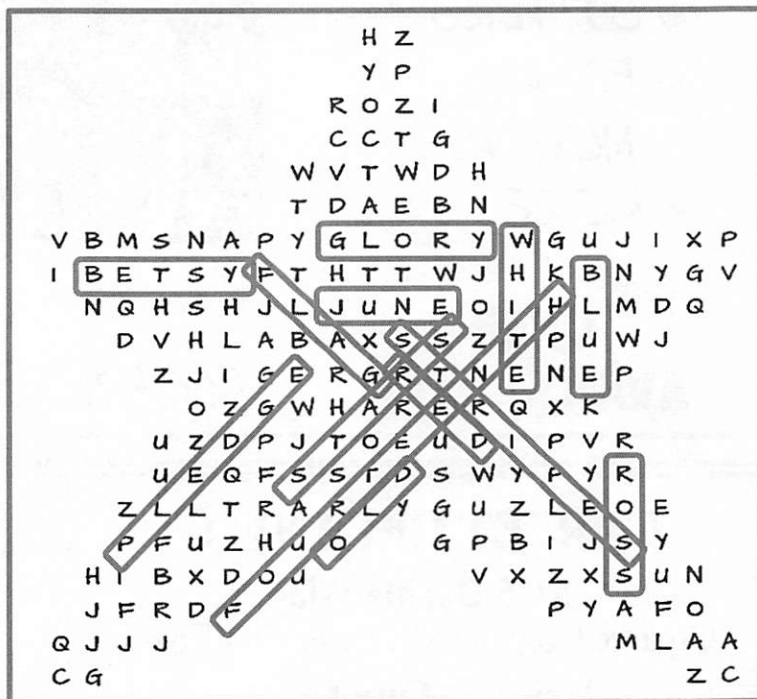
DANGEROUS WEED GRASSES

FOXTAIL PLANTS can be risky for your dog or cat. The barbed seed heads of the **foxtail** plant can work their way into any part of your dog or cat, from the nose to between the toes and inside the ears, eyes, and mouth. They can even simply dig themselves directly into a patch of skin. The **foxtail** plant is a grass-like weed coming in several species. They grow in Kearney Lodge Park. (Your editor knows of a toddler who swallowed one awn (seed) and required medical treatment.)

WORD OF THE MONTH: AWESOME adjective awe-some | \ 'ō-səm \
DEFINITION OF AWESOME

1a: inspiring awe - an *awesome* task/responsibility/a place of *awesome* beauty

b: *informal* : TERRIFIC, EXTRAORDINARY had an *awesome* time at the concert

2: expressive of awe - *awesome* tribute

SYNONYMS: amazing, astonishing, astounding, awful, eye-opening, fabulous, marvelous, miraculous, portentous, prodigious, staggering, stunning, stupendous, sublime, surprising, wonderful, wondrous

IS THE WORD "AWESOME" OVERUSED?

Many object to the use of "*awesome*" to describe something (such as a sandwich) that does not literally elicit feelings of awe. Yet the same people who insist that "*awesome*" should be used only of weighty subjects (Niagara Falls, man landing on the moon) will happily use the word "*awful*" in reference to something (such as a mess) that falls distinctly short of being "full of awe." This weakened sense was once considered improper – in fact, complaints about it persisted through the early decades of the 20th century.

The change in meaning that "*awesome*" is undergoing may be more recent than that of "*awful*", but both words are treading the same path. For evidence that such change is normal, we need look no further than "*awe*", which originally meant "terror" and now carries the weaker sense "wonder."
