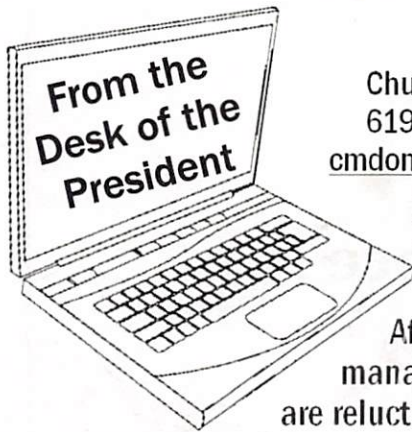

principal water sources, is being used to the max.

We are all encouraged to conserve water and elim-
inate waste. Otherwise, we could be facing water-
rate hikes and/or rationing in the not-too-distant
future.

Some things to consider: wash your car(s) at the
carwash (water is recycled there) – not the drive-
way; plant only native, drought-resistant plants;
water plants early in the morning, or in the even-
ing; do full laundry loads; take shorter showers;
or whatever else you can think of to cut down on
water waste.

month at the San Diego Food Bank.

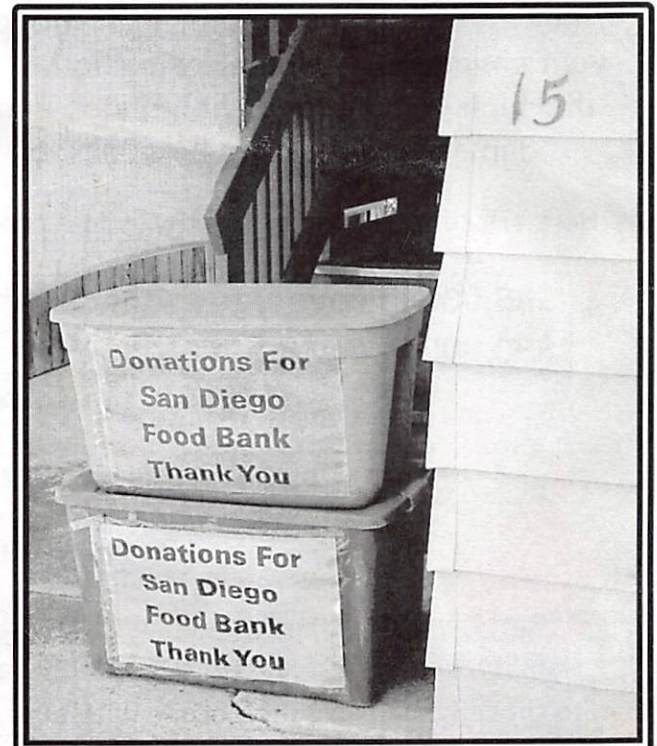

- 15 oz can Dennisons Lima Beans and Ham



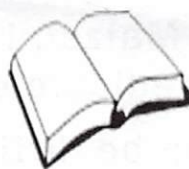
Combine all and bake at 350° F for 60 minutes. This is easy, quick, and oh, so yummy!

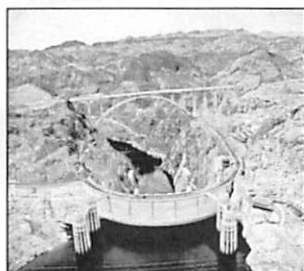

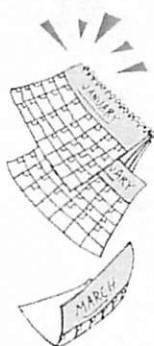

And twenty-nine in each leap year.

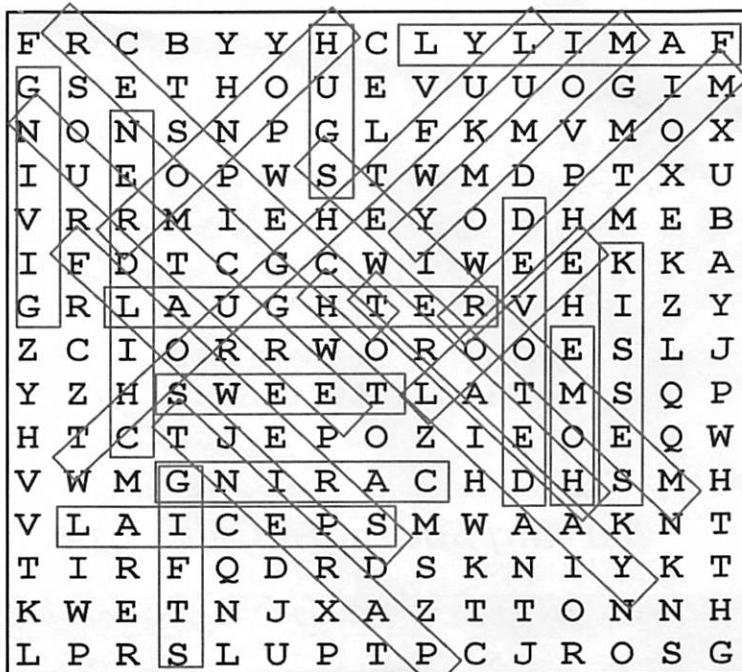


Another Variation
