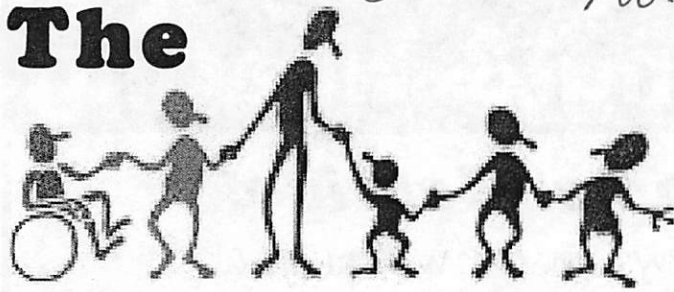

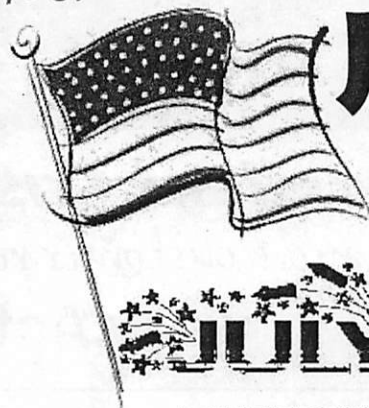

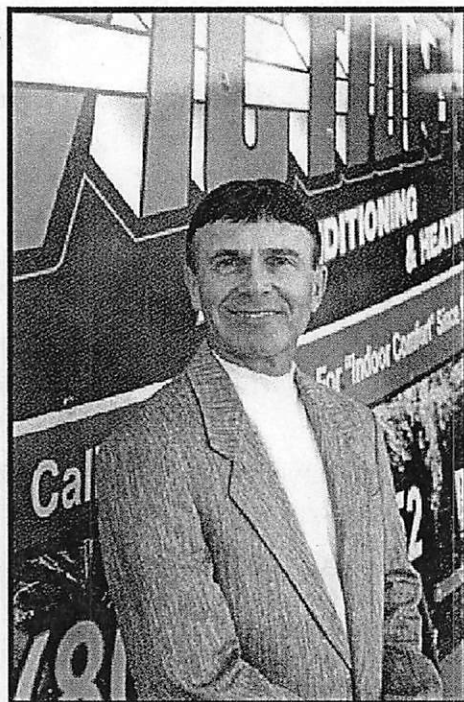

KLCC MEETING of 13 JUNE 2013 Cont.

1. Women's, Singles, Mixed Gender group—There was no one who wanted to coordinate. This will be dropped from the agenda until/unless someone volunteers to organize a group in the future.
2. New Bulletin Board—a glassed-in bulletin board will replace the current open bulletin board in front of the Clubhouse. It will be dedicated to KLCC business, event notices, etc. There will also be a new "mailbox" attached next to it that will replace the current suggestion box inside the Clubhouse.
3. Potential new cable offering—please let the office know whether or not you would be interested in the new cable offering that was reported in your bill-insert in May. There was confusion about the company that would be offering this. All questions should be addressed to the Park managers.
4. Swift Cable TV Phone Number—the number listed in the newsletter was published in error. It was the number for Walmart. Please see your Swift bill for the correct number.

NEW BUSINESS:

1. Suggestion box items—none this month
2. Suggestions from the floor:
 - Joe was asked to check with the Park managers to see if there would be a Park luau this summer
 - Questions were asked about Park rules and an accounting of what happens with the space rent paid by residents. Joe reminded residents to check the rules they were given when moving in. Any concerns about the rules must go to the Park managers. KLCC has no authority to change the rules. Also, Kearney Lodge is a business and KLCC has no ownership in that business. Thus, KLCC has no legal right to question how the space rent is determined or spent.
 - Several members reported seeing houses with no visible house numbers. Joe will suggest that Park managers survey and ask owners to post numbers.
 - Complaints were made about the increase in kids riding bikes and skateboards recklessly near the front streets of the park. Cars, trucks, and motorcycles continue to speed into and through the park. Members present voiced concerns that an accident is bound to happen, but had no solutions other than to report speeders to the park office and to let parents know when their children are observed riding dangerously in the park.
3. Pool use reminders—NO smoking, glass bottles, or alcohol at the pool; Food/non-alcohol drinks are okay around the pool's perimeter as long as persons who bring it pick up after themselves. Children 14 and under MUST be accompanied by the homeowner (18 and older).
4. Raffle drawing was held for the \$22 that was collected. The winner's name will not be disclosed.

Meeting was ended at 8:00 PM.

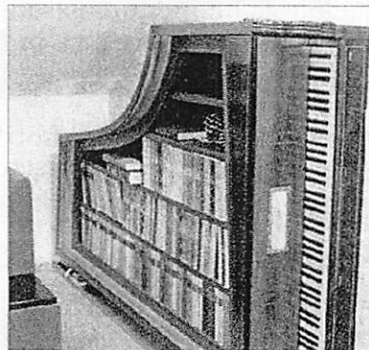

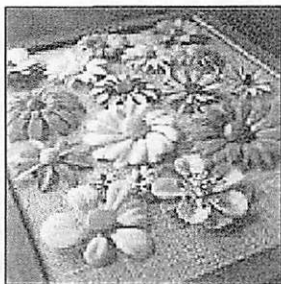

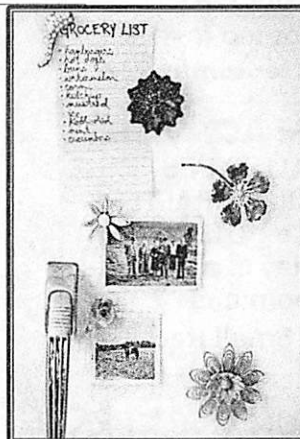

JEWELRY MAGNETS

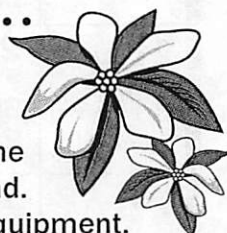

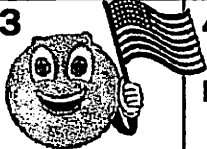
