Veterans Day 2018 marks the 100th anniversary of World War 1's Armistice Day. It is an official United States public holiday, observed annually on November 11, that honors

military veterans; that is, persons who served in the United States Armed Forces.

Veterans Day in the United States coincides with other holidays, including Armistice Day and Remembrance Day, that are celebrated in other countries that mark the anniversary of the end of World War I.

Major hostilities of World War I were formally ended at the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month of 1918, when the Armistice with Germany went into effect. The U.S. holiday was renamed Veterans Day in 1954.

Veterans Day celebrates the service of all U.S. military veterans, while Memorial Day honors those who died while in military service.

THANKSGIVING DAY IN THE USA

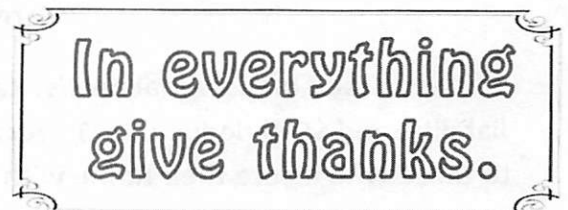
Thanksgiving, or Thanksgiving Day, is a public holiday celebrated on the fourth Thursday of November in the United States. It originated as a harvest festival. Thanksgiving has been celebrated nationally on and off since 1789, after Congress requested a proclamation by George Washington. It has been celebrated as a federal holiday every year since 1863, when, during the American Civil War, President Abraham Lincoln proclaimed a national day of "Thanksgiving and Praise to our beneficent Father who dwelleth in the Heavens," to be celebrated on the last Thursday in November.

Together with Christmas and the New Year, Thanksgiving is a part of the broader fall/winter holiday season in the U.S.A.

The event that Americans commonly call the "First Thanksgiving" was celebrated by the Pilgrims after their first harvest in the New World in October 1621. This feast lasted three days, and — as accounted by attendee Edward Winslow — it was attended by 90 Native Americans and 53 Pilgrims.

The New England colonists were accustomed to regularly celebrating "thanksgivings" — days of prayer thanking God for blessings such as military victory or the end of a drought.

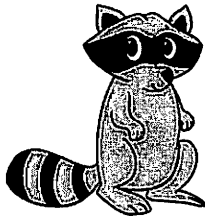

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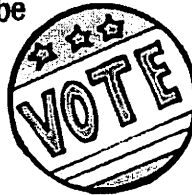


HOW TO DRAW A RACCOON

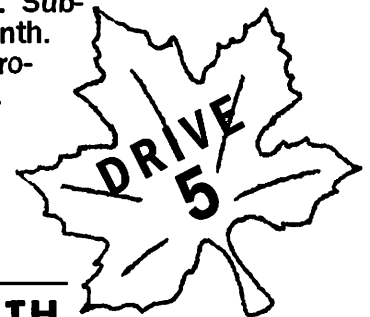

At least two units have been targeted by a peeping-tom who seems to have gone from looking to acting. A screened-in bedroom window, open to the evening air, is the newest scene of the crime. Police have been notified, but no suspects have been apprehended.

Additionally, property has been taken from the clubhouse, homes and vehicles; bicycles are also missing again. In more than several occasions, non-

residents have been spotted digging in the recycle bins at night. They have also been entering and or using the clubhouses, bathrooms and laundromats.

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MIRAMAR LANDFILL CLOSED SUNDAYS

This began Oct. 7, but the notice came too late for the October issue. The Miramar Landfill is now closed on Sundays and on the three major summer holidays:

Memorial Day, Mon., May 27, 2019,
Independence Day, Thurs., July 4, 2019,
and Labor Day, Mon., Sep. 2, 2019.

Closing the landfill, located at 5180 Convoy St., on Sundays will reduce equipment expenditures, and improve staff coverage and customer service during the new Monday through Saturday schedule. Signs are posted at the Miramar Landfill to notify the public about this change.

The landfill is also closed on Thanksgiving Day, Thurs., Nov. 22, 2018; Christmas Day, Tuesday, Dec. 25, 2018; and New Year's Day, Wednesday, Jan. 1, 2019.

1. Do not respond to emails requesting personal or financial information.
2. Avoid clicking on unknown links that could track your behavior or corrupt your device.
3. Think twice before opening emails with generic salutations like "Sir," "Madam," or "Customer."
4. Make sure that links and email addresses are legitimate before interacting with them.

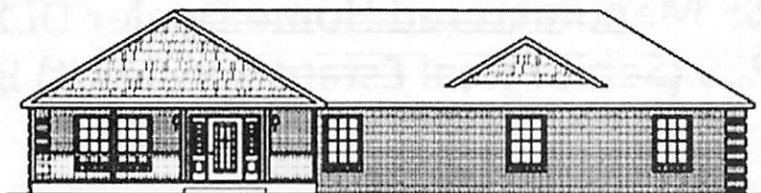
