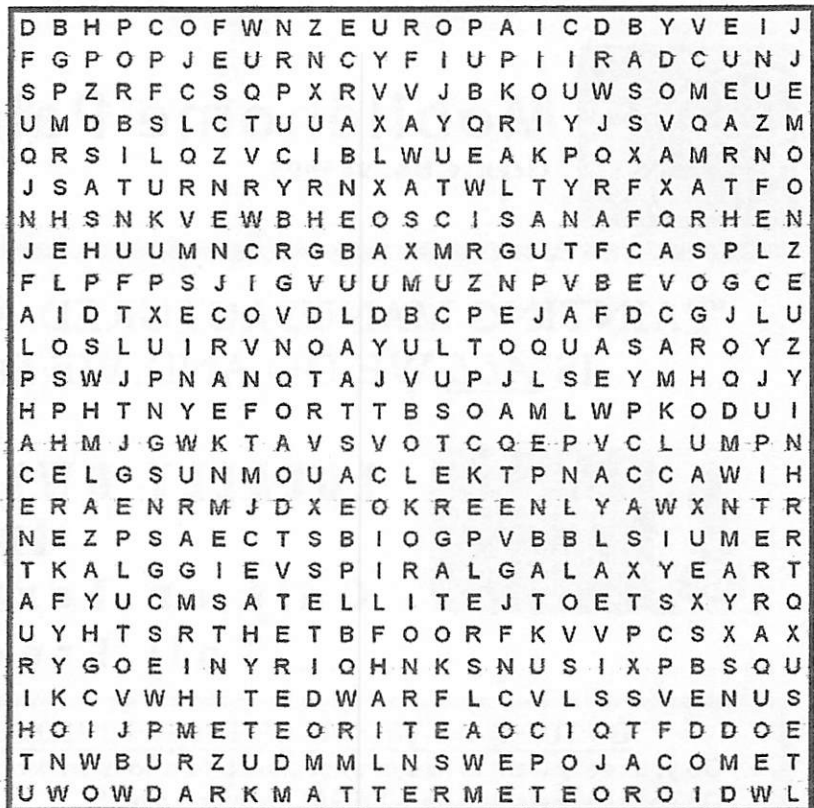
You also may volunteer. Additional drivers would be beneficial. Call a KLCC officer listed on page 3.

Air-filtering Houseplants

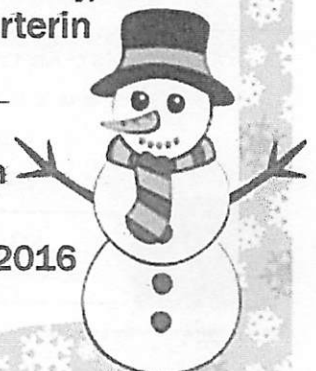


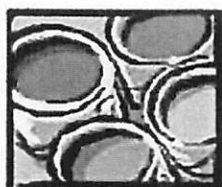

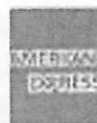
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Kearney Lodge Community Connection 2016 Officer Election

the pot's lip to hold bags in place, as shown.

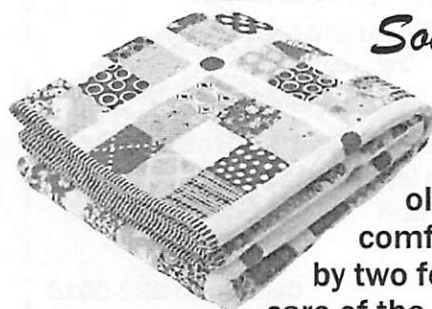

Something FOR Your Pets

Consider using a folded, extra or old comforter or quilt. When folded to about two by four feet, the comforter or quilt will fit two small pets who get along. Folded to two by two feet, it is just right for one small pet. Other folded sizes will take care of the pet who really *s t r e t c h e s* out to sleep.

Strawberry Banana Cheesecake Salad



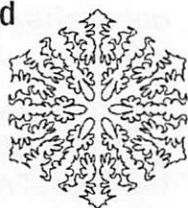
INGREDIENTS:

- 1 bag mini-marshmallows
- 16 oz. vanilla yogurt
- 1 regular-sized tub of Cool Whip
- 1 package no-bake cheese cake filling

Stir together the first four ingredients; then stir in the next two ingredients.

- 1-2 containers strawberries, sliced
- 3-4 bananas, sliced

Other fruits can be substituted or added as desired. Best served chilled and on the same day due to banana discoloration.



(NOTE: Bananas can be sliced directly into a bowl of lemon juice; then drained. The lemon juice slows/prevents discoloration.)

3 hrs. (includes freeze time) — 2-1 cup servings
INGREDIENTS:

- 2 bananas, sliced, frozen
- ½ cup strawberries, frozen
- 2 tbsp. heavy cream
- ½ teaspoon vanilla



INSTRUCTIONS:

Place all of the ingredients in a food processor and blend until smooth. The consistency should be like soft serve ice cream. Transfer to a freezer safe container large enough to hold 2 cups, and freeze for at least 3 hours. Scoop like ice cream and serve cold.
