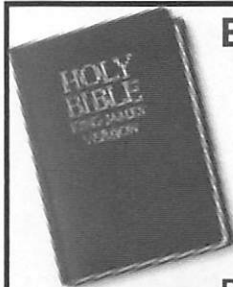
Independence Day



In 1775, people in New England began fighting the British for their independence. On July 2, 1776, the Congress secretly voted for independence from Great Britain. Two days later, on July 4, 1776, the final wording of the Declaration of Independence was approved, and the document was published. The first public reading of the Declaration of Independence was on July 8, 1776. Delegates began to sign the Declaration of Independence on August 2, 1776. In 1870, Independence Day was made an unpaid holiday for federal employees. In 1941, it became a paid holiday for them.

The first description of how Independence Day would be celebrated was in a letter from John Adams to his wife Abigail on July 3, 1776. He described "pomp and parade, with shows, games, sports, guns, bells, bonfires, and illuminations" throughout the United States. However, the term "Independence Day" was not used until 1791.

Interestingly, Thomas Jefferson and John Adams, both signers of the Declaration of Independence and presidents of the United States, died on July 4, 1826 - exactly 50 years after the adoption of the declaration. It is also important to note that Native Americans lived in the country and each tribe had its own nation and government prior to the European settlers

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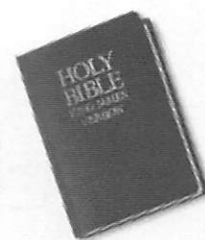

Olive Garden Zuppa Toscana

DIRECTIONS: In a large pot over medium heat,

cook 1 Lb hot Italian sausage, breaking up with the back of a wooden spoon, until browned and no longer pink, 5 to 7 minutes. Transfer to a plate to drain.

Add ½ chopped onion to pot and let cook until soft, 5 minutes, then add 2 cloves garlic and cook until fragrant, 1 minute more. Season with salt and pepper. Add 4-5 cups chicken broth and potatoes and cook until potatoes are tender, 20 to 25 minutes.

Stir in a hand full of kale and let cook until leaves are tender and bright green, 3 minutes, then stir in heavy cream, cooked sausage, and ½ cup cooked bacon and simmer 5 minutes more.

Season with pepper, garnish with Parmesan cheese, and serve.

When I took over as president three months ago No one knew where the Articles were. I Completed the "Business Entities Records Order Form" requesting a certified copy of the articles of incorporation on May 22, 2017 to the CA Secretary of State.

Results of Certified copy returned to me on June 3, 2017.

Registered Name; C1661655 KEARNEY LODGE MOBILE HOMEOWNERS ASSOCIATION.

Article II-B; The specific purpose of this corporation is to *purchase or prepare to purchase the Kearney Lodge Mobile Home Park, 6460 Convoy Court, San Diego, CA.*

Article IV; notwithstanding any of the above statements of purposes and powers, this corporation shall not, except to an insubstantial degree, engage in any activities or exercise any powers that are not in furtherance of the specific purposes of this corporation.

Past years 990 & 199. As of May 21, 2017 a Business Search provided the following information, business name; KEARNEY LODGE MOBILE HOMEOWNERS ASSOCIATION.

Tax Number; C1661655
