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LAWN BOWLING ANYONE?

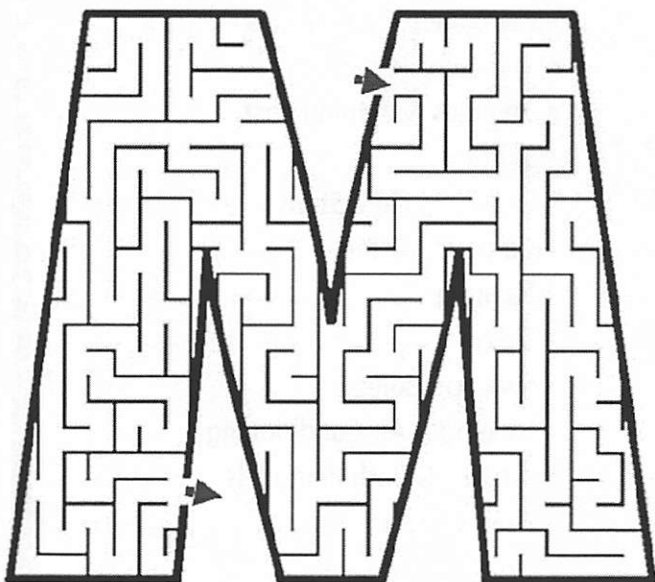

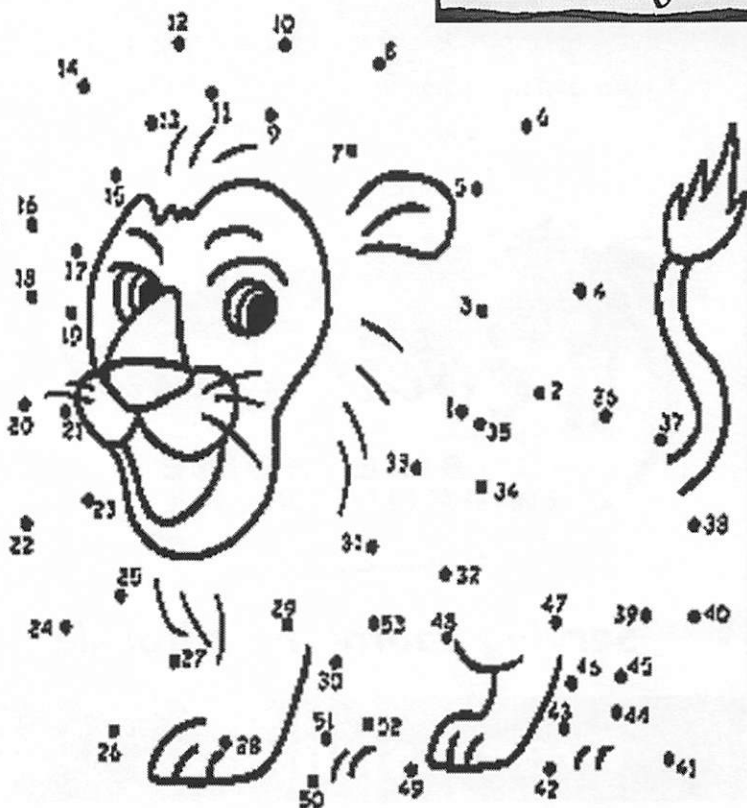
A LOCAL BIRD

CROCHET A BELT

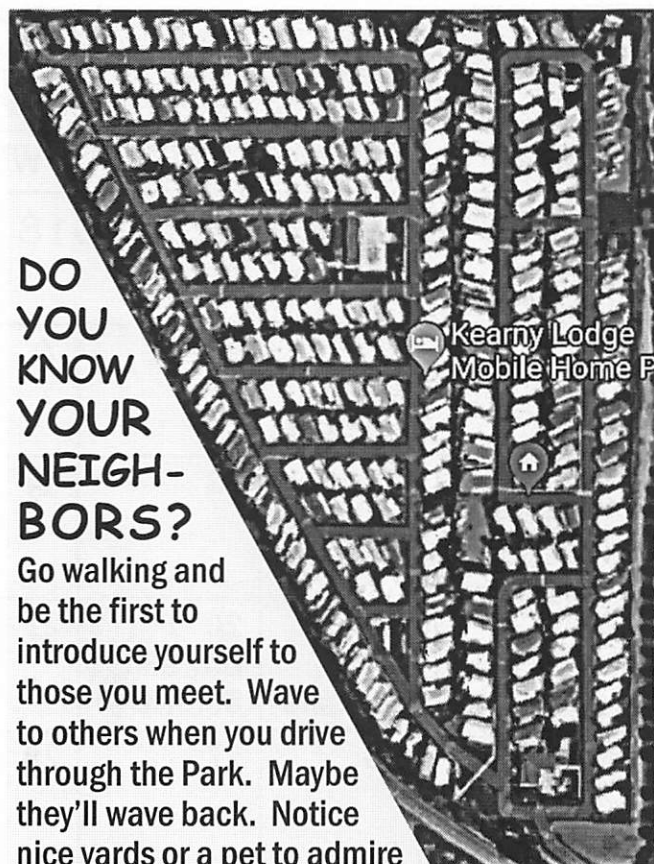
- MATERIALS:**
- Twine or other cord
 - Size I crochet hook

- 1-in. width of fabric strip (length = waist + 12 in.)

INSTRUCTIONS:

1. Measure your waist.
2. Ch length of your waist in inches + 3 chs.
3. Dc in 3rd ch from hook and in each ch across, fasten off.
4. Cut a 1-inch-wide strip of fabric the length of your waist measurement + 24 inches (use pinking shears to prevent fraying).
5. Evenly weave fabric strip through the belt, leaving equal amounts of extra fabric length on each end; knot to belt at ends.

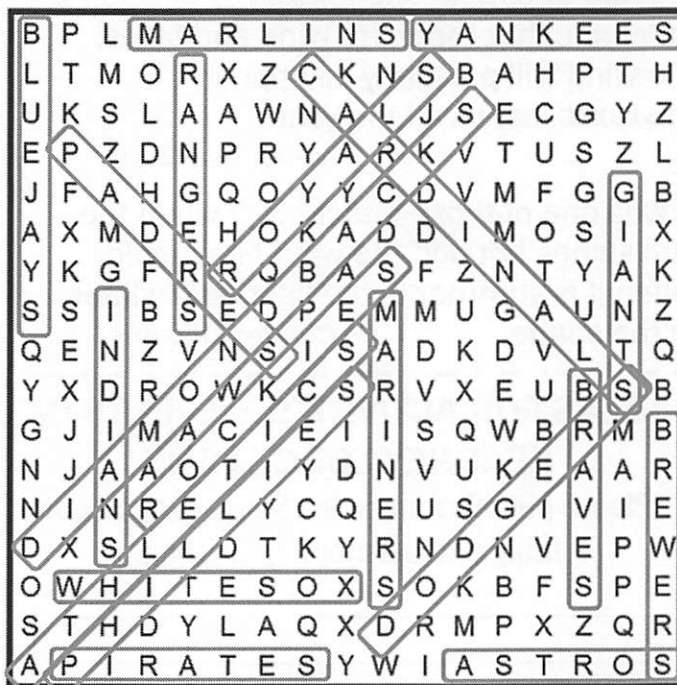
