GREAT USES FOR LIMES AND LEMONS

1. **STRENGTHEN BRITTLE NAILS:** An easy home remedy for brittle nails is soaking them in lemon juice for 10 minutes. Rinse well with warm water. Not only will your fingernails be stronger, but they will brighter too.
2. **LIGHTEN FRECKLES AND AGE SPOTS:** Freckles and age spots don't have to be permanent. Simply mix a pinch of sugar with 2 tablespoons lemon juice and apply with a Q-tip or cotton ball on a freckle or age spot every day until it is lightened.

5. **FEVER REDUCER:** Reduce a fever naturally with 1 ½ teaspoons Cream of Tartar, ½ teaspoon lemon juice, 2 ½ cups warm water, and ½ teaspoon honey. Sip slowly.

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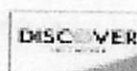
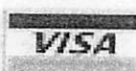

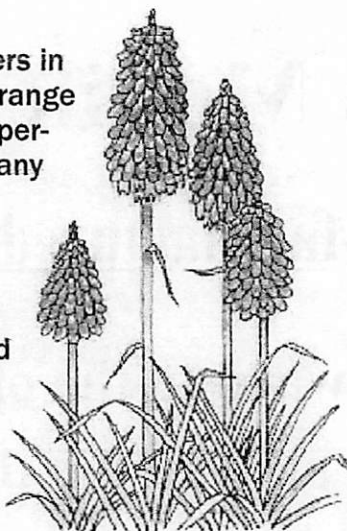

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WHAT TO DO AFTER AN EARTHQUAKE HITS: 7 KEY THINGS TO KNOW

California's Office of Emergency Services recommends to check yourself first for injuries after an earthquake strikes before you attempt to help others. Don't try to move seriously injured people unless they are in immediate danger of further injury. Remember to *drop, cover, and hold* in the event of an aftershock.

Here are seven other key things to remember after a quake strikes:

DO NOT USE THE PHONE: Unless there is an immediate, life-threatening emergency, do not use the phone, or electrical switches or appliances. Sparks can ignite gas. Phone lines are also frequently overwhelmed in disaster situations and they should be clear for emergency calls to get through.

USE BATTERY-POWERED EQUIPMENT: Listen to a portable, battery-powered radio or television and use battery-powered flashlights or lanterns.

DON'T TURN OFF GAS AT THE METER UNLESS YOU SUSPECT A LEAK: Check for a gas leak. If you smell gas, hear gas escaping, or see a broken gas line, evacuate the building. Find a phone away from the building, perhaps a neighbor's home, before calling your utility or 911. If any one of these conditions is met and the situation is safe, turn off the gas shutoff valve near the gas meter. But **DO NOT** shut off the gas service shutoff valve near the gas meter if you do not suspect a gas leak because there could be a big delay before the utility turns your gas back on.

DRESS FOR PROTECTION: Long pants, long-sleeved shirts, sturdy shoes and work gloves can help protect you from getting hurt by broken objects.

STAY OUT OF DAMAGED BUILDINGS: Inspect your home for damage and get everyone out if you determine it isn't safe. Damaged buildings may be destroyed during aftershocks. Check walls, doors, floors, the ceiling, staircases, and windows to make sure your building is structurally sound. Watch for loose plaster or drywall. Be on the lookout as well for cracks and damage to chimneys and foundations.

STAY AWAY FROM DOWNED OR DAMAGED POWER LINES: Never touch wires lying on the ground or hanging from poles. Downed wires could kill you if touched, PG&E warns.

TAKE PICTURES: Taking photos of your house and property can help with insurance claims.

SOME USES FOR APPLE CIDER VINEGAR



HAIR: Apple cider vinegar can be used as a rinse for your hair after shampooing to add healthy body and shine. Recycle an old shampoo bottle and fill it with 1/2 a tablespoon of apple cider vinegar and a cup of cold water. Pour through your hair after shampooing.

FACE: Dilute apple cider vinegar with two parts water, and spread the mixture over your face with a cotton ball as a toner. You can do this at night after washing, and in the morning before you apply your moisturizer. You can also dab apple cider vinegar directly onto age spots and leave them on overnight to lighten their color.

HANDS AND FEET: Treat your tired and swollen hands and feet to a massage with apple cider vinegar to relieve them.

SUNBURN: Add a cup of apple cider vinegar to your bath and soak for 10 minutes to ease a bad sunburn.

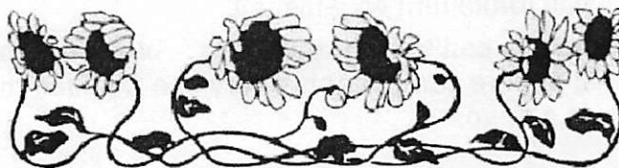
TEETH: Rub teeth directly with apple cider vinegar and rinse to help remove stains from teeth.

WEIGHT-LOSS: For daily weight and pH balance maintenance, add 2 teaspoons of apple cider vinegar to 16 oz. of water. Sip this mixture throughout the day.

CLEANING: Mix 1/2 cup of apple cider vinegar with 1 cup water. You can use this mixture to clean microwaves, bathroom tiles, kitchen surfaces, windows, glasses and mirrors. It also works as a disinfectant.

FLEA REDUCTION: Add a little bit of apple cider vinegar to your pet drinking water. Rub apple cider vinegar onto your pet's skin. Or spray apple cider vinegar, diluted 50 percent with water, onto your pets and your furniture to repel fleas.

CHILDREN: WHICH PLANTS TO AVOID – BEAUTIFUL BUT TOXIC

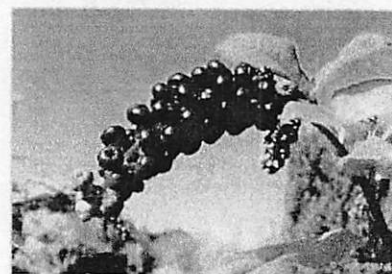
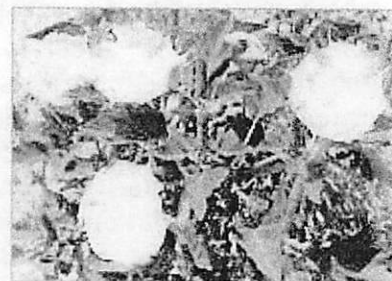
Bright colors, shiny leaves, tempting little fruits – all this makes some plants an irresistible attraction, especially for children, who discover the world by looking, touching, smelling and tasting everything they are able to reach. However, the beautiful plants in your garden at home can be seriously dangerous to the health and life of your children, because there are many that are poisonous and may provoke allergic reaction and anaphylactic shock.

Parents must be careful throughout the whole year and should not underestimate the risks that their garden has for their children. In order to be calm and respond adequately to different situations, you not only need to know the plants in your home and garden, but also know how to react in cases when your child has tasted a poisonous plant. Knowing the poisonous plants and the symptoms they cause, as well as the necessary first aid measures can prevent or minimize some serious health issues and prove life-saving if your child swallowed a piece of a poisonous plant.

Make sure you talk to your children about the risks and danger that certain flowers hide, show them the plants that they must not taste in any way and explain them why.

Here is a list of some beautiful but also pretty poisonous plants with which you should be careful:

- Oleander (*Nerium oleander*): All parts of the plant are poisonous, especially the leaves.
- Lily of the valley (*Convallaria majalis*): The red seeds of the plant, its blossoms and young leaves are primarily poisonous.
- Belladonna (*Atropa belladonna* = deadly nightshade): All parts of this plant are very poisonous, so make sure you keep your children away from it.
- Datura (*Datura stramonium* = Jimson Weed, Nightshade, Peru-apple, Angel Trumpet): Datura is a highly-toxic plant, because all of its parts are very poisonous, and can be lethal. If your child has swallowed some parts of the plant go to the hospital immediately!
- Yellow acacia (*Cytisus laburnum*): The flowers and seeds of this plant, which look like small beans, are highly poisonous. Go to the nearest hospital immediately.
- Yellow jasmine (*Gelsemium sempervirens*): One of the twenty most poisonous plants in the world. All parts of the plant contain strychnine. The nectar of the plant is toxic even for the bees.
- Pokeweeds (*Phytolacca* = pokeweed, pokeberry, poke, inkberry, pigeon-berry): This plant contains substances such as phytolaccatoxin and phytolaccigenin, which may cause itching, vomiting, shortness of breath, sweating, tremors, diarrhea and seizures. Severe poisoning may cause slow breathing, dizziness, coma and even death.



First aid measures for plant poisoning

1. Find the plant that your child has swallowed and take some leaves, blossoms and seeds for samples if necessary.
2. Make your child drink a large amount of fluids. Don't give them any milk or carbonated drinks.
3. Make the child rinse their mouth and wash their skin.
4. Go to the nearest hospital as fast as you can.

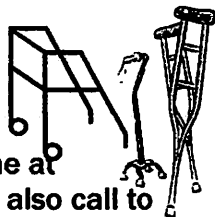

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TREASURE-HUNTING TIPS: NAVIGATING FLEA MARKETS, YARD SALES and THRIFT STORES

- Start at the back. Folks usually start at the front. Check the back for stuff that hasn't been pawed through yet.

A REMINDER TO KEARNEY LODGE RESIDENTS

Please inform your guests of Park rules, or remind them if they have visited before. There are people violating the Park rules in swimming pool use, thereby violating our rights as residents.

"12. RECREATION RULES: F. Swimming Pool: THERE ARE NO LIFEGUARDS AT THE POOL. USE OF THE POOL BY HOMEOWNER AND HIS/HER GUESTS IS AT THEIR OWN RISK. Children under the age of 14 should not use the pool without a person who is 18 years of age or older. The use of the swimming pool by the Homeowner and his/her guests is restricted to the rules and hours posted at the pool. Homeowners must vacate the pool together with all guests at the direction of the management if management determines that posted rules are being violated or if the pool needs to be closed for any purpose."

There are age rules, a residency requirement or a guest of a resident, and common sense requires there be no glass containers in the pool areas. Common sense also indicates that ALL swimmers should be in groups of two (2) or more considering that there are no life guards.

This article does not eliminate rules posted at each pool. Adult residents can enforce the rules and should report continued infractions to Management - in person, by phone or by a note slipped into the office door slot. Get names, license plates numbers, vehicle descriptions, etc. Clubhouse rental does not include exclusive use of the pools, and all the other rules are still in effect.
