









The State of California lifted our suspension so paperwork could be submitted to add Joe Beatty as the new President of KLCC, which will continue to designated by the State as a Homeowners Association.

HOUSEKEEPING CONCERNS:

- Because the minutes from the December meeting did not make the deadline for inclusion in the newsletter this month (JAN), copies were made available at this meeting. They were approved. (There is a copy of the Minutes in the KLCC Notebook in the main Recreation Room.)
- 2. Ellen has volunteered to check with five local businesses to see if they would be interested in placing an ad in our newsletter. A suggestion was made that anyone who frequents local businesses can take a copy of our newsletter to those businesses and encourage them to consider advertising. The newsletter is distributed to about 325 (all) households in the park. The newsletter deadline is the 15th of **OUOTE**
- 3. Joe reminded everyone to speak one at a time.

COMMITTEE REPORT:

- 1. Block Captains: Nothing to report this month
- 2. Street Naming: No timeline has been determined yet. Joe will check with the park managers again.

OLD BUSINESS:

- 1. Transportation: Another park resident volunteered to provide transportation if needed. Joleen will post a reminder in the newsletter.
- 2. The speaker for emergency preparedness has not set a date yet. Bonnie will call back. A date will be chosen that allows us to publicize it in the newsletter.
- 3. Because Joe could not access the minutes via the computer, he did not ask about opening the RV park for other cars, nor about cleaning up vacant lots in the park. He will ask this month.
- 4. Safe place for kids to play: Just as in other neighborhoods, parents are cautioned to provide safety rules for their kids to follow, and to monitor where they are playing. It is also the responsibility of Park residents to follow the speed Limit in the park, which is designed to keep kids and anyone else who uses our streets safe. Please watch for kids and pedestrians, and drive carefully.
- 5. Park managers inspect street lights once a week and replace burned out bulbs. They will look into adding lights to a few areas that are dimly lit at present.

NEW BUSINESS:

- 1. Suggestion box items: none were received this month
- 2. Issues raised by members at the meeting:
 - a. KL has a Facebook page that keeps residents informed
 - b. The women's restroom at the back pool is extremely hot. Joe will inform managers as this is not only uncomfortable but may be a waste of energy.
 - c. Someone asked if the park has shuffleboard equipment and if not, could the Park purchase and make this available. Also, can the shuffleboard outline be repainted? Joe will ask the managers.
 - d. Bingo night has been cancelled until further notice. If interested in seeing it come back, express your interest at the KLCC meetings or in the suggestion box. (And see front page!) (Cont. on Page 5)

Lightly mash avocados and lime with a fork in a bowl. Stir in other ingredients. Serve immediately or cover and chill for up to three (3) hours.




