Memorial Day in the United States is observed on the last Monday of May. It was formerly known as Decoration Day and commemorates all men and women who have died in military service for the United States.

It is traditional to fly the flag of the United States at half staff from dawn until noon. Many people visit cemeteries and memorials, especially to honor those who have died in military service. Many volunteers place an American flag on each grave in the national cemeteries.

Memorial Day started as an event to honor Union soldiers who died during the American Civil War, inspired by the way the Southern states honored their dead. After World War I, it was extended to include all men and women who died in any war or military action.

Memorial Day was originally known as Decoration Day. The current name came into use after World War II. Decoration Day and then Memorial Day used to be held on May 30, regardless of the day of the week on which it fell. In 1968, the Uniform Holidays Bill was passed as part of a move to use federal holidays to create three-day weekends. Beginning in 1971, the Memorial Day holiday has been officially observed on the last Monday in May. However, it took longer for all American states to recognize the new date.



Greetings from your President:

Low water pressure has been reported throughout the Park since the new water regulators have been installed. Management says that the water pressure is within the range of being proper. If you believe that your water pressure is too low, contact Management and they will have someone check the pressure going into your home.

Any time the water is shut off, and then restored, you should check the screen on the end of the spout for small pebbles or calcium deposits, any of these things will reduce the water pressure significantly.

We have a new Chair Person for our Medical Devices loan program, her name is JoAnne Brownwood. She can be reached at 858-213-3767. The new location for storing the devices will be in a new shed purchased by management, located in the small vehicle storage lot, next to unit 217.

Facts about Coyotes

Generally, coyotes are reclusive animals who avoid human contact. Coyotes who have adapted to urban and suburban environments, however, may realize there are few real threats and may approach people or feel safe visiting yards even when people are present. These coyotes have become habituated (lost their fear of humans), probably owing to the bounty of food that they have become accustomed to feeding upon in your neighborhood. These bold coyotes should not be tolerated or enticed but instead given the clear message that they should not be so brazen. (Continued on Page 9)

Coyote Hazing - Hazing is a method that makes use of deterrents to move an animal out of an area or dis-courage an undesirable behavior or activity. Hazing can help maintain a coyote's fear of humans and deter them from backyards and play spaces.

Methods of hazing - Using a variety of different hazing tools is critical so that coyotes don't get used to redundant or single stimulus devices, sounds, and actions. Yelling and waving your arms while approaching the coyote.



- · Noisemakers: voice, whistles, air horns, bells, "shaker" cans full of marbles or pennies, pots, lid or pie pans banged together
- · Projectiles: sticks, small rocks, cans, tennis balls or rubber balls
- Other: hoses, water guns with vinegar water, spray bottles with vinegar water, pepper spray or bear repellent.

In your yard - Remember, keeping pets and pet food inside is the best way to keep coyotes out of your yard. If you do encounter coyotes, all of the above methods can be used in your yard at home. First, try the "Go away coyote!" method (yell and wave your arms as you approach the coyote). Here are some additional methods you can also use:

- Squirt the coyote with your garden hose.
 Spray the coyote with vinegar water.
- Bang pots and pans together.

Do not

feed the

coyotes.

Important things to remember

- Never run away from a coyote!
- The coyote may not leave at first, but if you approach them closer and/or increase the intensity of your hazing, they will run away.
- If the coyote runs away a short distance and then stops and looks at you. continue hazing until he leaves the area entirely.
- After you have successfully hazed a coyote, they may return. Continue to haze the coyote as you did before; it usually takes only one or two times to haze a coyote away for good.
- If you see or have any contact with a Coyote, notify Management at 858-277-6060.



FLAG ETIQUETTE IN

THE UNITED STATES

Federal law stipulates many aspects of flag etiquette.

The section of law dealing with **American Flag** etiquette is generally referred to

as the Flag Code. Some general guidelines from the Flag Code answer many of the most common questions:



- The flag should be lighted at all times, either by sunlight or by an appropriate light source.
- The flag should be flown in fair weather, unless the flag is designed for inclement weather use.
- The flag should never be dipped to any person or thing. It is flown upside down only as a distress signal.
- · The flag should not be used for any decoration in general. Bunting of blue, white and red stripes is available for these purposes. The blue stripe of the bunting should be on the top.
- The flag should never be used for any advertising purpose. It should not be embroidered, printed or otherwise impressed on such articles as cushions, handkerchiefs, napkins, boxes, or anything intended to be discarded after temporary use.
 - Advertising signs should not be attached to the staff or halyard. The flag should not be used as part of a costume or athletic uniform, except that a flag patch may be used on the uniform of military personnel, fireman, policeman and members of patriotic organizations.
- · The flag should never have any mark, insignia, letter, word, number, figure, or drawing of any kind placed on it, or attached to it.
- The flag should never be used for receiving. holding, carrying, or delivering anything.
- When the flag is lowered, no part of it should touch the ground or any other object; it should be received by waiting hands and arms. To store the flag, it should be folded neatly and ceremoniously.
- · The flag should be cleaned and mended when necessary.
- When a flag is so worn it is no longer fit to serve as a symbol of our country, it should be destroyed by burning in a dignified manner.



BERRY SMOOTHIE BOWL




