

#### WHAT IS PASSOVER?

Passover is the eight-day observance commemorating the freedom and exodus of the Israelites (Jewish slaves) from Egypt during the reign of the Pharaoh Ramses II.

A time of family gatherings and lavish meals called Seders, the story of Passover is retold through the reading of the Haggadah. With its special foods, songs, and customs, the Seder is the focal point of the Passover celebration. Passover begins on the 15th day of the Jewish month of Nissan. As the Jewish day begins at sundown the night before, for the year 2005, the first night of Passover will be April 23rd.

#### CONTROLLING INFLAMMATION

Prostaglandins, a group of hormones, regulate inflammation. That means that some of these hormones increase inflammation and some of them reduce it. Your diet can affect this system. Here are a few tips to try. You should notice results in about four-to-six weeks:

- ~ Add turmeric and ginger to your diet they are natural anti-inflammatory agents.
- ~ Eliminate polyunsaturated oils and partially hydrogenated oils from your dietary intake. They encourage synthesis of proinflammatory prostaglandins. It's also a good idea to get rid of trans-fatty acid sources, like margarine or shortening.
- ~ Switch to using olive oil in your diet and increase your omega-3 fatty acids intake. Good sources of these are wild Alaskan salmon, sardines, walnut and soy foods. This will increase your production of inhibitory prostaglandins.

# GET FREE TREES FOR YOUR YARD Cool Communities Shade Trees Program Renewed!

People for Trees is excited to announce that the Cool Communities Shade Trees Program, in conjunction with the San Diego Regional Energy Office and SDG&E, has been renewed. This program allows people to receive up to five free trees for their private property.

The program is intended to increase shade around homes which will in turn decrease energy costs involved with air conditioning. A tree that loses its leaves can also promote sunshine to warm a home in the winter. The entire county of San Diego is eligible. The trees must be planted within 50 feet of the home and on the south, east, or west sides only. This program is open to any private residence or public school with an SDG&E account. (The Kearney Lodge master meter system is okay – I checked. ~Ed.) This program will be similar to our street tree pro-gram in that we need multiple people to get involved to plan a planting.

#### SENATOR KEHOE ANNOUNCES CHARGERS NOT TO SEEK REDEVELOPMENT FUNDS OR STADIUM PROJECT

SAN DIEGO- Senator Christine Kehoe (D-San Diego) today announced that the San Diego Chargers have backed away from plans to seek a redevelopment designation for the stadium site in Mission Valley. Such a designation would have given the NFL team city redevelopment tax funds to help finance a new stadium.

"I am pleased that the Chargers agreed with me that this is an inappropriate use of the redevelopment designation," stated Senator Kehoe. "I am delighted that the Chargers have responded to the community, and dropped their original plan."

The Senate Local Government Committee that Senator Kehoe chairs had scheduled a hearing at Qualcomm Stadium on this issue for late February. The hearing has been cancelled in response to the announcement of the San Diego Chargers.

"Historically, redevelopment funds go to revita-lize blighted neighborhoods and Mission Valley just isn't a blighted area. Simply because some-one wants a state-of-the-art stadium doesn't mean the public should help pay for it. This is very welcome news from the Chargers," Kehoe continued.

Senator Kehoe also announced that she will be holding a Local Government Committee hearing in Sacramento next month to discuss the legal requirements and particulars of redevelopment designations and funding.

# PETROLEUM DEMAND REDUCTION BILL INTRODUCED ~ Legislation to curb oil consumption in favor of alternatives

SACRAMENTO – Senator Christine Kehoe (D-San Diego) announced that she has introduced Senate Bill 757 which would create a plan to halt the historic increases in petroleum usage in California by the year 2010, and to ultimately achieve a significant reduction in oil consumption in this state by the year 2020.


SB 757 would also require that several state and local agencies work cooperatively to adopt rules and regula-tions to ensure that existing refineries install the latest available technology and pollution prevention measures to reduce air pollution and toxic waste generation at the refineries, while enhancing both worker safety and the public's health.

"Thirty percent of California's oil comes from foreign sources," noted Kehoe. "If we do not halt the increasing demand for petroleum, and ultimately reduce our con-sumption patterns, our dependence on foreign sources will only increase. This places us at the mercy of other countries that will continue to control our oil supply and help dictate the price we pay at the pump," stated Kehoe. "Technology already exists for fuel alternatives to help satisfy the state's growth, and this should be a key component in our efforts to reduce our dependence on foreign oil and gasoline imports," Kehoe continued.

California currently leads the nation in gasoline consumption and is the second largest consumer of petroleum products in the nation, behind only Texas. California currently imports ten percent of its gasoline, and over fifty percent of its oil from outside sources. The need to import gasoline is expected to rise, as is the importation of oil as California reserves are depleted.

"World instability, and the wildly fluctuating price at the pump clearly point out the need to try to promote measures which will enhance California's energy inde-pendence," concluded Kehoe.

SB 757 is awaiting referral to a Senate Policy Committee for its initial hearing.



## SENATOR KEHOE APPOINTED TO CHAIR COMMITTEE ON LOCAL GOVERNMENT

SACRAMENTO - State Senator Christine Kehoe (D-San Diego) was appointed to chair the Senate Committee on Local Government by President pro Tempore of the Senate, Don Perata. The Local Government Committee is responsible for hearing legislation related local governmental procedures and organization, land use, and administration.

"One of the many challenges facing Californians is how to improve communication and coordination between local and state governments," Kehoe said. "I will focus on issues that include finance, state mandates, and building better communities."

Senator Kehoe served as a member of the San Diego City Council from 1993 to 2000, she represented the city on San Diego's Regional Planning Agency (SANDAG), served on their Committee on Binational Regional Opportunities (COBRO), and chaired SANDAG's Regional Economic Prosperity Board. While on the City Council, she spearheaded an award-winning revitalization project, the City Heights Urban Village, which brought over \$100 million of investment into the area. She served as a California Coastal Commissioner from 1997 to 2000, and authored a bill signed by the Governor to establish a regional planning agency in San Diego County through public consensus to deal with traffic congestion, land use, sprawl and quality of life issues.

Senator Kehoe has also been assigned to serve on following standing committees:

~ Budget and Fiscal Review

~ Energy, Utilities and Communications

~ Natural Resources & Water

~ Transportation & Housing

"I am pleased that my committee assignments are in areas that matter to San Diegans," said Kehoe. "This gives me an opportunity to better protect our environment, help reduce traffic gridlock, work on making housing affordable, and continue working on lowering gas prices."

Senator Kehoe represents the communities of Del Mar, Rancho Penasquitos, La Jolla, Pacific Beach, Mission Beach, Ocean Beach, Point Loma, Clairemont, Del Cerro, El Cerrito Heights, Mission Valley, Navajo, Normal Heights, Kensington, Talmadge, Oak Park, Paradise Hills, Rolando, San Carlos, Serra Mesa, University Heights, Allied Gardens, the College Area, Linda Vista, Mission Hills, Mira Mesa, Tierrasanta, Clairemont, North Park, Old Town, downtown San Diego, and portions of Lemon Grove, and La Mesa.

### SENATOR KEHOE NAMES COUNCILMEMBER DONNA FRYE "Woman of the Year"

SACRAMENTO - In a ceremony today at the State Capitol, Senator Christine Kehoe (39th District) honored San Diego City Council member Donna Frye as the Senate District's "Woman of the Year." The special commemoration recognizes exemplary Cali-fornia women from each Senate District in the state.

Council member Donna Frye made national headlines as the "surfer girl" who ran as a write-in candidate for Mayor of the City of San Diego. The results of the race have challenged our courts to count every vote.

"This past year Donna stood out as a real leader in San Diego - in a time when our city was seeking a new kind of leadership. I commend her for having the courage and determination to run for Mayor. Her popularity among San Diegans is well deserved, and I am honored to pay tribute to such a dedicated public servant."

Elected by special election to complete an unexpired term in June 2001, Council member Frye was re-elected to a full, four-year term in March 2002 with 65 percent of the vote. Frye is an environmental activist since the 1980s, has a keen understanding of the community and its needs, and she strongly believes that government should be open and accessible to its constituents.

#### **ANOTHER HEALTHY OIL**

A surprising oil could play an important part in the heart-health picture. In a study, people who used rice bran oil in their diets experienced significant reductions in both their total and LDL cholesterol. After substituting the oil for other fats in their diets, the study partici-pants experienced a 7 percent reduction in LDL. Use this nutty oil to sauté veggies or as a base for salad dressings or dipping sauces.

**RealAge Benefit:** Reducing your total cholesterol to 160 mg/dl or lower can make your RealAge as much as one year younger.

Both total and LDL cholesterol are important, modifiable risk factors for cardiovascular disease. High LDL cholesterol levels may lead to the buildup of dangerous artery-clogging plaques. Good ways to keep your cholesterol under control include choosing fats that are mostly unsaturated, such as olive oil and rice bran oil; getting plenty of soluble fiber in your diet (at least 25 grams of total fiber per day); and exercising regularly. Good sources of soluble fiber include whole-grain breads and cereals, dried beans and peas, Brussels sprouts, oranges, prunes, and oat bran.

Do both sides of each license, credit card, etc. You will know what you had in your wallet and all the account numbers and phone numbers to call and cancel. Keep the photocopy in a safe place. Also carry a photocopy of your passport when you travel either here or abroad.

We've all heard horror stories about the fraud (identity theft) that's committed against us by the stealing of a name, address, Social Security number, and credit cards.

We have been told we should cancel our credit cards immediately. But the key is having the toll free numbers and your card numbers handy so you know whom to call. Keep those where you can find them.

Now, here are the numbers you always need to contact when your wallet, etc., has been stolen:

- ~ Check out the company before giving it access to your account information and make sure it is easy to reach if something goes wrong.

- Ask for a "switch kit" if you change banks. Often banks will handle the paperwork to switch automatic payments to your new account.
