Joleen Joy Gonser was born on September 22, 1941, in Billings, Montana, to Rushford and Irmina Kittle. She is the oldest of six children. By the age of 18, Joleen and her family lived in 19 different homes; eleven cities, mostly in California.

Joleen was heavily involved with the Civil Air Patrol, Auxiliary USAF (volunteers), in Bishop, California. After the family moved to San Diego, she met William Wayne Gonser, who was in Civil Air Patrol here. After six months of working together in CAP, then a month of courting, Joleen agreed to marry William. She relayed that after the first or second meeting in fall 1959, William told his mother that he had found the love of his life! They were married May 7, 1961.

Though not blessed with children, they were blessed with many friends and a large family. Both enjoyed working with the Civil Air Patrol of which they

were members for more than 30 years. Unfortunately, William passed away in 1993.

Joleen's life has been full of adventures. She loves telling stories and sharing memories. She continues to make new memories everyday by welcoming new residents and visiting with people as she walks the park. She is a caring neighbor and trusted friend.

Joleen moved into Kearney Lodge on April 14, 1994. She became involved with the community immediately by assisting with the newsletter, and has been the editor of "The Connector" newsletter for over 20 years. In addition to being the editor, she ensures that it is properly delivered to all 300+ mobile homes in the park.

Joleen was mostly an administrative assistant beginning with Bell Telephone, and then in many other companies. She was the voice of San Diego Group 3, Civil Air Patrol, for several years as the Information Officer. She has always been there to help people in need.

If you ever receive an email from Joleen, you will always see a Bible verse on the bottom of the page. She said that she does this because "I am a Christian". She is a member of Meridian Southern Baptist Church in El Cajon. She was a Sunday School teacher at several churches from 1975 to 2014.

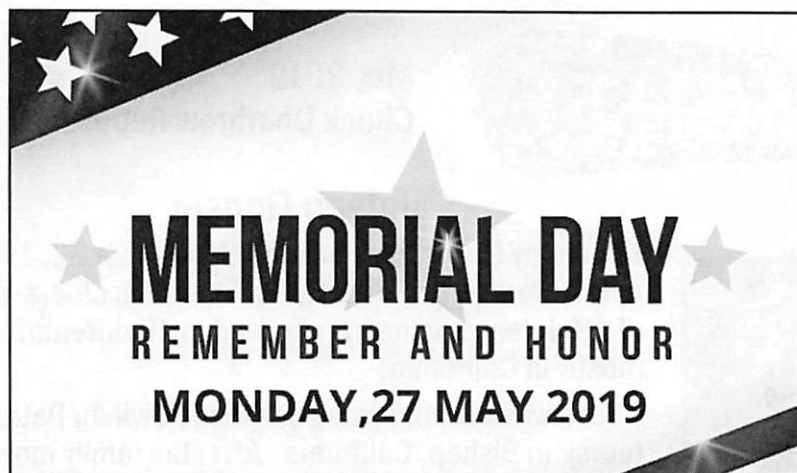
Best Yard of the Month May 2019 Unit 327

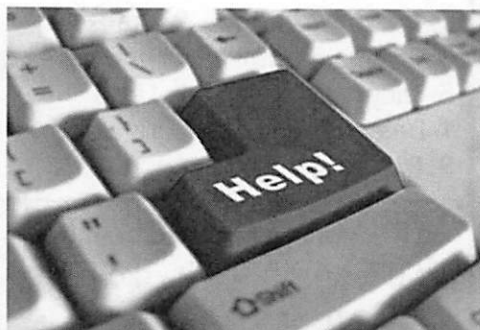
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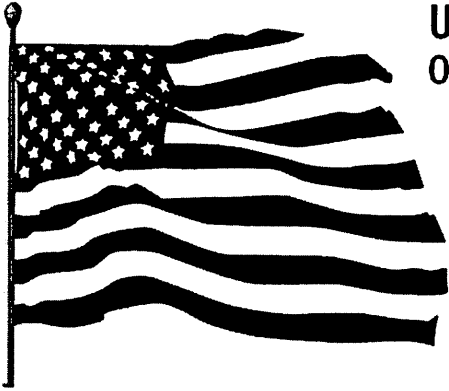
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U.S. FLAG ETIQUETTE: WHAT NOT to DO

Out of respect for the American flag, the United States Flag Code outlines what NOT to do with the flag. Here are a few key points:

- Do not display the flag during inclement weather, unless it is an all-weather flag.
- No other flag or pennant should be placed above, at the same level or to the right of the American flag.
- Do not display the flag with the union down. This is a signal of distress.
- Never carry the flag flat or horizontally.
- Don't drape the flag over the hood, top, sides of back of a car, train or boat. If displayed on a car, fix it to the chassis or the right fender.
- Do not dip the flag to any person or thing.
- Never allow the flag to touch anything beneath it, such as the ground.
- The flag should not be displayed or stored in a way that may damage or soil it.
- Do not place anything on the flag. Also, the flag should not be used for advertising, printed on napkins or boxes, embroidered on cushions or handkerchiefs, used in costume, or used to cover a ceiling.

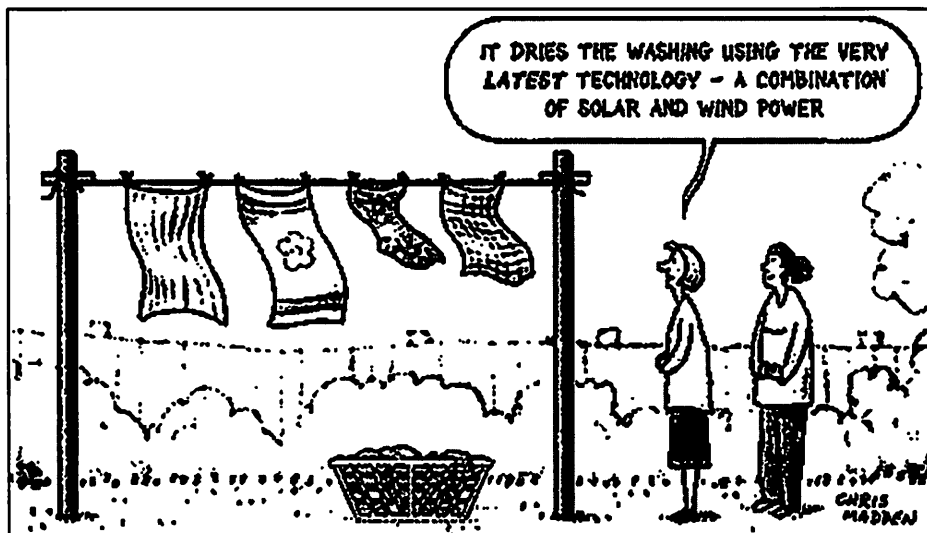


GRADUATION TIME IS COMING UP!

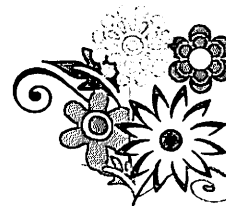
Do you know anyone, maybe even in your own family, who is graduating soon — college, high school, middle school, and other schools.
