THE BOMB (Part 2)

Last month, we noted that the first atomic bomb was successfully detonated 75 years ago on July 16, 1945 in the desert of New Mexico. As the US was still at war with Japan, President Truman now had to make a critical decision – should he use the next bomb to destroy an entire Japanese city?

After consulting with his advisors (some of whom were for and some against), Mr. Truman decided to use it. He gave as his main reasons:

1. wanting to end the war as quickly as possible,
2. his desire to avoid having to invade Japan which undoubtably would cost the US hundreds of thousands of casualties.

The city chosen to be the victim was the mid-sized port city of Hiroshima. The city was strongly supporting the war effort and was yet to be heavily bombed.

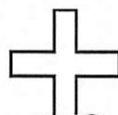

This month's recipe is from Ellen Conrad and is just in time for the summer zucchini harvest.

ZUCCHINI BREAD

* 1 ½ Cup grated zucchini
 ** ½ Cup apple sauce
 ¼ Cup Light brown sugar
 1 Cup Granulated Sugar
 1/3 Cup oil 2 Large eggs 1 tsp Vanilla
 1 ½ Cup all purpose flour
 ½ tsp, baking soda ½ tsp, baking powder
 ½ tsp, salt *** ½ tsp, cinnamon

In a large bowl combine zucchini, sugars, apple sauce, oil, eggs, and vanilla. Whisk until blended. Add the flour, baking powder, salt, baking soda and cinnamon. Stir into wet until no dry remains. Pour into greased loaf pan. Bake in a preheated 350° oven for 55 minutes. Remove to wire rack and let cool completely. It is better if refrigerated for 12 hours. Store covered in fridge.

* grate using largest holes on box grater
 ** I didn't have apple sauce, so I grated an apple into the zucchini
 *** I used a little more than ½ tsp cinnamon because I didn't think that ½ tsp would be enough.

HOUSEHOLD TIP

CLEAN YOUR REFRIGERATOR COILS

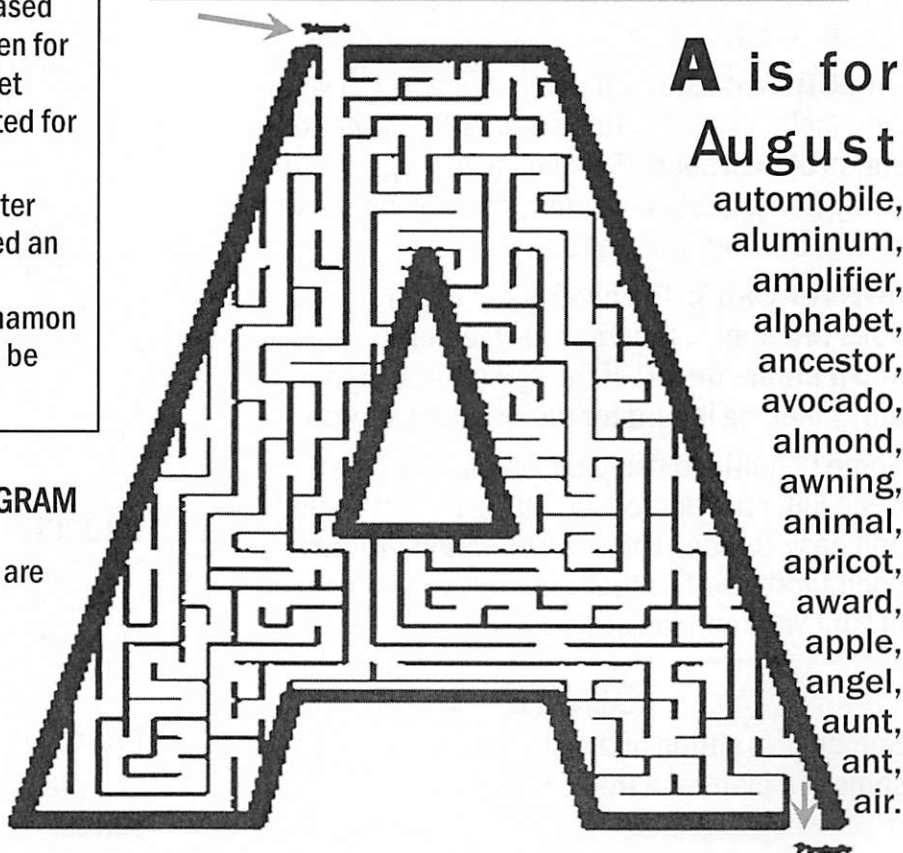
You can eliminate more than 70% of service calls with this simple cleaning step. Not to mention saving over \$5 to \$10 a month on electricity because the fridge is not running efficiently.

Do it twice a year or more often if you have shedding pets. Their fur clogs up the coils quickly.

Condenser coils are located on the back or across the bottom of your refrigerator.. These coils cool and condense the refrigerant. When the coils are clogged with dirt and dust, they cannot efficiently release heat. The result is your compressor works harder and longer than it was designed to, using more energy and shortening the life of your fridge.

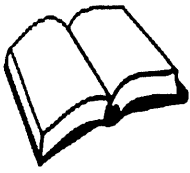
Clean the coils with a coil cleaning brush and vacuum. A coil cleaning brush does a thorough job and will easily pay for itself. The refrigerator coil brush is bendable to fit in tight areas. They can be used to clean your dehumidifier and air conditioner coils too.

LOW-COST 2-INGREDIENT WEED SPRAY

This weed killer is a powerful all-natural herbicide, but it can kill both weeds and other plant life, so be careful not to accidentally splash it on any plants you want to keep! Adding the small amount of dish soap to the mix helps the vinegar stick to your weeds, rather than dripping off.

DIRECTIONS: Add your desired amount of white vinegar to a spray bottle, along with 1 (one) teaspoon of dish soap. Stir the mixture gently. This spray works best on a sunny, dry day; not as well on a cool, cloudy or wet day.

HOW IT WORKS: The acetic acid in the vinegar does two things: it burns the weed on contact, and it lowers the pH of the soil (at least temporarily,) making it hard for the weeds to regrow.

Some benefits to using this cheap and easy weed killer are low cost, non-toxic, fast-acting, and easy-to-use. This mixture would probably be good for the weeds that grow between the edge of your yard and the street.

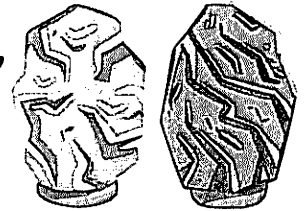

Himalayan salt lamps are made from large pieces of salt mined in the Himalayas. If your pet licks the salt lamp repeatedly, it can lead to salt poisoning. Initially, salt poisoning may lead to vomiting, diarrhea, decreased appetite and lethargy; excessive thirst or urination can also occur. Neurological symptoms, including incoordination, tremors, seizures, and coma can also result from salt poisoning.

If you have a salt lamp in your home, keep it out of your pet's reach; if this is not possible, and you suspect your pet is licking it, remove it.

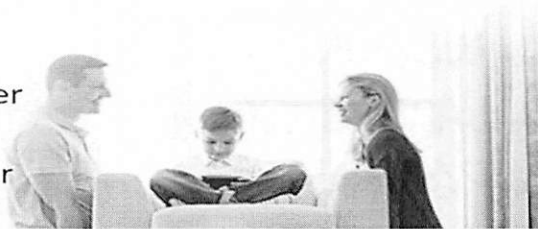

at the time consisted of military personnel.

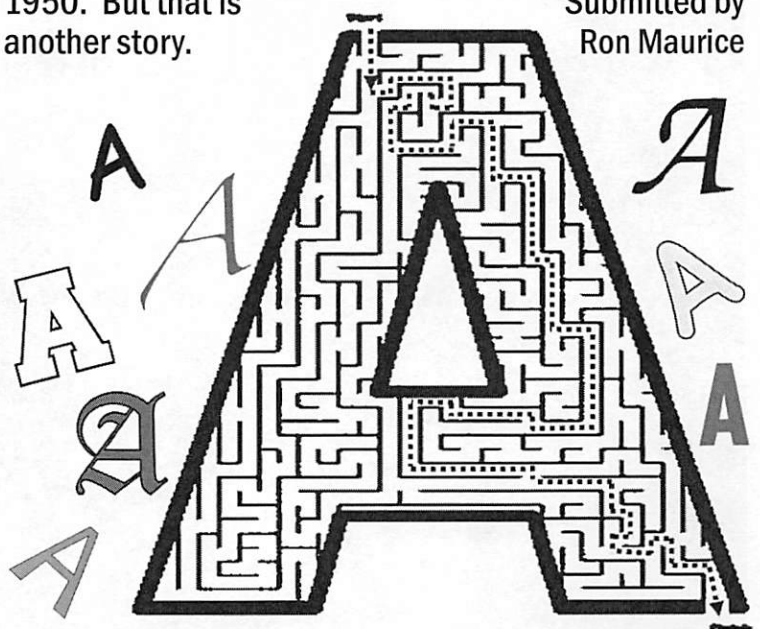
The date selected to drop the bomb was August 6, 1945. Early in the morning on this date, three superfortress B-29 bombers took off from Tinian Island in the Pacific. The lead bomber, piloted by Col. Paul Tibbets, was named the Enola Gay after his mother. The bomb itself was called "Little Boy".

It was still morning when the bombers finally arrived over the city. It was a beautiful day. The bomb was dropped as scheduled and from a great height, giving the bombers barely enough time to escape the enormous blast. It detonated above the city as planned and the city was leveled in a matter of seconds. 70,000 persons were killed instantly, and additional thousands later died from injuries and radiation poisoning.

Unfortunately, it took a second bomb which destroyed the city of Nagasaki on August 9, 1945 to bring Japan to its knees and surrender. The unofficial surrender took place on August 15, 1945. This day is known as V-J (Victory over Japan) Day. After more than six years, World War II was finally over. Wild celebration broke out all over the USA. Once again, we were at peace, although the official surrender ceremony did not take place until September 2, 1945 aboard the USS battleship Missouri in Tokyo Bay, with General Douglas MacArthur presiding.

The US would be blessed with five years of peace before the next conflict. The Korean War erupted in 1950. But that is another story.

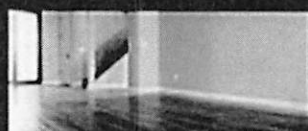

WORD OF THE MONTH "STENTORIAN"

adjective | sten-TOR-ee-un Definition: extremely loud

The Greek herald Stentor was known for having a voice that came through loud and clear. In fact, in the *Iliad*, Homer described Stentor as a man whose voice was as loud as that of fifty men together. Stentor's powerful voice made him a natural choice for delivering announcements and proclamations to the assembled Greek army during the Trojan War, and it also made his name a byword for any person with a loud, strong voice. Both the noun "*stentor*" and the related adjective "*stentorian*" pay homage to the big-voiced warrior, and both have been making noise in English since the early 17th century.

Example: " 'Laughing together is as close as you can get with out touching,' I wrote in my first book Laughter has always been the best medicine; I wasn't exactly making any boldly original statement almost three decades ago. I wasn't expecting a MacArthur grant. But what I expected even less ... was that the not-touching part of my line would eventually be part of a "*stentorian*", global prescription to combat COVID-19."
