

- 3. Emergency preparedness—the speaker is preparing flyers to be distributed in the April newsletter advertising his presentation for the May 9th KLCC meeting. Discussion later in the meeting around whether this was considered "solicitation" concluded that it was not—the speaker will simply inform residents of the kinds of products available. Residents can stay to consult individually, or can call later, if they are interested in purchasing anything.
- 4. Shuffleboard—all votes received in the suggestion box and at the meeting were in favor of keeping the shuffleboard. Joe will inform park management.
- 5. Bingo has already resumed every Friday starting at 7:00 PM in the front clubhouse.
- 6. Battery disposal—the park managers do not want a bin of hazardous material sitting on the premises. One suggestion was for the KLCC to consider taking on a project of having someone announce they will collect batteries once every month (or once every 6 months) and take them to the dump for hazardous disposal. No motion was made; no one has volunteered yet. Call ahead (858-694-7000) to make sure they are open (usually Mon-Fri, 6:30 AM to 5:00 PM); take picture ID with address and a bill showing city residence. Tabled (un)til next meeting.
- 7. Lights—Joe will ask the park managers to check whether or not light sensors are working properly as it was reported last month that lights up front were coming on at 4:00 PM and turning off by 7:00 PM.

7. (continued) There were reports this month that a number of lights are not working at all, or the lamp posts are missing from places where they used to be. Joe will ask about this and report at next meeting.

EVERYONE FOLLOW THE RULES to set up a space. Joe will ask Elyse to advertise in the Pennysaver and on Craig's List. Beth Ann volunteered to make a bigger sign for the sale, and maybe for the KLCC meetings, too.

9. Dumpster day will be April 27. If you have large items contact the office and/or leave them outside your home (labeled for the dumpster) and the park managers will pick up for the dumpster.

10. Page 13 in your park rules talks about plantings on your property. If you have further questions about who is responsible for maintaining, moving, or removing any plants, bushes, or trees in your space, contact the park managers.

Members present agreed to do this; secretary will add as an "agenda item" for future meetings.

3. A complaint was received that someone who had scheduled a party in the front clubhouse with the park office found someone else using the room on the same day. Another resident said the clubhouse was locked on a Sunday recently. Not much can be done without specific dates and times being reported directly to the park managers to follow through. Joe will report the general complaints to the office, and also report hours when the clubhouse is open at next meeting.

a. Mary Jo unlocks the clubhouse and pool in the mornings

b. Security locks the clubhouses in the evenings

4. Another complaint was made about kids riding toy-vehicles and bicycles in the streets in ways that are dangerous. If you see this, report to the park manager with date and time, and where the children live if known. If you have children, please monitor their bike, skateboard, and toy-vehicle behavior to keep them safe. Remember that Hickman Field is in the process of being upgraded, and it may be the closest and safest place for kids from the park to play.

5. Question was asked: can the stop signs in the park be enforced with tickets? It may be that even if you cannot get a city ticket, if you violate the park driving rules, you may experience a residential consequence. Joe will ask the park managers.

6. Bushes at the front entrance (by stop sign as you enter the park) and by the mailbox are impeding drivers' vision, especially after dark. Joe will report to the park and ask if these can be

trimmed back.

7. Question was asked: can the park create a foot path in the dog run area that does not get muddy, similar to the walkway they created along the drive into the park? Also, can they remove the foxtails that are out there since these were re-ported to be poisonous (dangerous) to dogs?

8. Raffle drawing was held for the \$21 that was collected. Winner's name will not be published. \$5:00 was donated back to KLCC by the winner.




