Kearney Lodge is a very quiet and safe place to live.

There has been one burglary and the issue of a peeping Tom which the San Diego Police Department are working on, and a few thefts from carports. The information in this article is not to scare or upset our residents but to give you all the information we have gathered for you to decide if you want more protection.

Our K. L. Neighborhood Watch committee met on December 11th to discuss ways for our residents to protect their families and property. We came up with a number of things we can do, but it all boils down to what is best for you. Here is a list of some of the things we talked about.

1. Satisfied with the security you have for your home at present time.
2. Install sensor lights over back and front doors. One can buy these at Home Depot for about \$20.00 each (Recommended).
3. Install it yourself security cameras researched by Block Captain Cindy Mancol. One can purchase these at Amazon, Home Depot and Walmart for \$39.00 to as much as \$500.00. Do it yourself cameras will save you a monthly charge.
4. If desired, you to can go with a security company such as Protect America at \$19.99, ADT at \$36.99, or Vivint at \$53.99. Cost is over a standard 36-month contract.

Most security companies will give you free equipment and free installation. Here is a question you must ask: **What's The Right Amount of Sensors for me?** The inclusion of sensors is one of the most important aspects of home security equipment, most notably when these sensors and their control panel are connected to a central monitoring station.

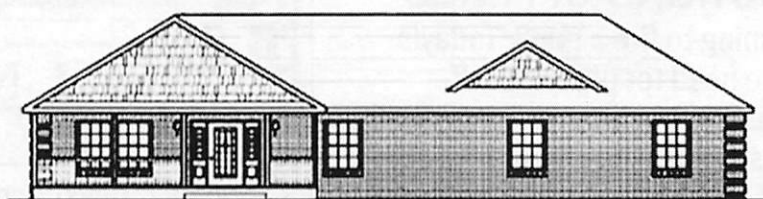

If an alarm system company attempts to operate without connection to a monitoring station, or without security sensors, the system is not a trustworthy system. Only install and operate all-encompassing home security units that guarantee your protection. “How many sensors do I need?” The ideal approach to home security and sensor installation is to place a sensor on every single door and window in a home. This includes sliding doors. All points of entry should be protected with

these movement alerting devices. If homeowners don’t have enough sensors for their properties, they often opt to place sensors on every point of entry, specifically the most important points of entry.

Remember: A Burglar’s Main Target is the Front Door. Since the home begins at the front door, the home security unit should as well. In roughly 34 percent of burglaries, forced entry was used on the front door to gain access to the home. Houses that are equipped with home security units are also three times less likely to fall victim to burglary.

Not only are these statistics crucial in supporting the installation of home security equipment, but they also imply the importance of door and window sensors, especially at the front door. Protecting these areas will also deter burglars who don’t want to deal with loud alarms and give themselves away.

After installing your protection gear, remember to place signs in your front yard and window decals that advertise the protection you have.

The Amount of Cameras Necessary. As you might have guessed, the number of cameras necessary to protect a home are fully dependent on the variables present in the home. “How big is the house?” “How many doors and windows are present?” “Where is the home located?” “Is it in the country or farther away from the city?”

There isn’t a one-size fits all answer for how many cameras a home needs, rather a breakdown of what locations in the home will need cameras, and then homeowners can determine their needs from there.

POINTS OF EMPHASIS

Entryways and Exits: Security cameras should be placed at all entry points and exits in the home. As we have mentioned previously on our blog, over 34% of break-ins occur at the front door, and other notable locations include back doors, side doors and windows, and garages.

It might not be feasible for you to secure every single door and window in the home, but you should begin by accounting for the main points of entry – front door, back door, backyard, and notable side entries.

All Outdoor Areas That Lead to the Home. Thieves may use foliage and bushes in the front or back yard to hide themselves as they attempt a break-in.

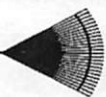
Any area outside that leads to the home should be protected. Cameras should be pointed on the backyard, the driveway leading up the carport, and the front yard.

KL Management camera coverage. Kearney Lodge Management gave the following camera information. There are 15 cameras located in four common areas; parking area next to unit 155, the north pool area, the parking area next to the east laundry room, and complete coverage around the front office, which covers the park entrance. K.L. Management does not want to give out any other information at this time.

KL Management has also listened to our concerns on park lighting. Seven areas have been suggested for new street lights and has been agreed to, work has already started. All residents with questions concerning Park security should contact their Area Block Captain; if we don’t have the answer, we will get you an answer.

I want to thank all our Block Captains for their dedication to our programs, making Kearney Lodge a safe place for all our residents. Our last meeting had 100% participation from all 12 Areas.

EXPLANATION FROM YOUR EDITOR

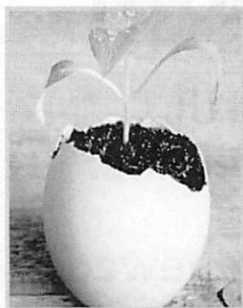

CHRISTMAS LIGHT STORAGE

For this nifty trick, look no further than

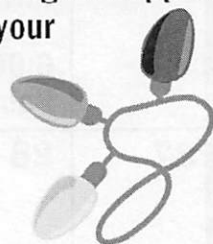


your number one closet essential: a clothes hanger. (One with a bit of extra bulk is best, although skimpier plastic ones can do in a pinch.) Loop the lights around the hanger, working from one end to the other, until you reach the last few inches of the strand. Loosely tie the leftover cord around the hook of the hanger.

For extra-streamlined storage, coordinate your set's bulbs with hangers of the same shade—white lights with white hangers, red

or multicolored lights on red hangers, and so on—then hang in the closet using your repurposed organizer's hook. If closet space is tight, consider attaching an S-hook to the middle of the hanger's base and suspending another light-wrapped bundle from it. Tuck the hangers alongside your favorite Christmas sweater so lights remain organized and easy to access next year.

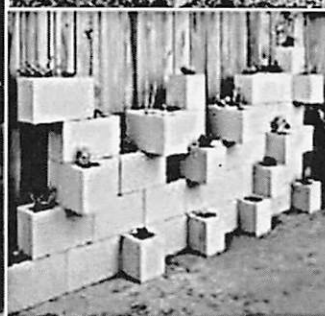
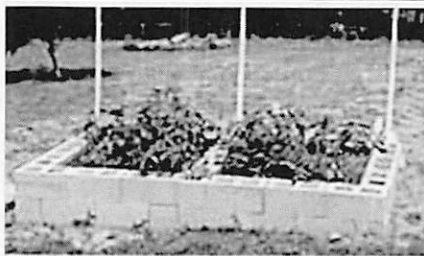
