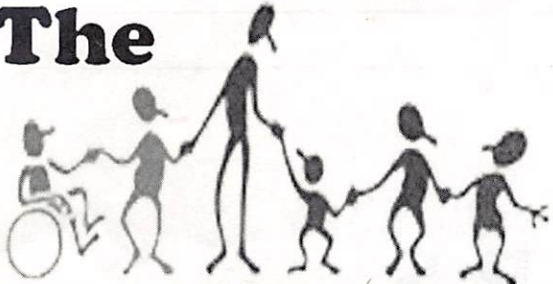

RECOMMENDATION REGARDING THE USE OF CLOTH FACE COVERINGS

CDC continues to study the spread and effects of the novel coronavirus across the United States. We now know from recent studies that a significant portion of individuals with coronavirus lack symptoms ("asymptomatic") and that even those who eventually develop symptoms ("pre-symptomatic") can transmit the virus to others before they show symptoms. This means that the virus can spread between people interacting in close proximity—for example, speaking, coughing, or sneezing—even if those people are not exhibiting symptoms. In light of this new evidence, CDC recommends wearing cloth face coverings in public settings where other social distancing measures are difficult to maintain (e.g., grocery stores and pharmacies) especially in areas of significant community-based transmission. This is now mandatory in San Diego.

It is critical to emphasize that maintaining 6-foot social distancing remains important to slowing the spread of the virus. CDC is additionally advising the use of simple cloth face coverings to slow the spread of the virus and help people who may have the virus and do not know it from transmitting it to others. Cloth face coverings fashioned from household items or made at home from common materials at low cost can be used as an additional, voluntary public health measure.

The cloth face coverings recommended are not surgical masks or N-95 respirators. Those are critical supplies that must continue to be reserved for healthcare workers and other medical first responders, as recommended by current CDC guidance.

This recommendation complements and does not replace the President's Coronavirus Guidelines for America, 30 Days to Slow the Spread external icon, which remains the cornerstone of our national effort to slow the spread of the coronavirus. CDC will make additional recommendations as the evidence regarding appropriate public health measures continues to develop.

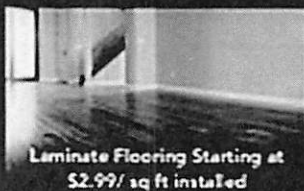
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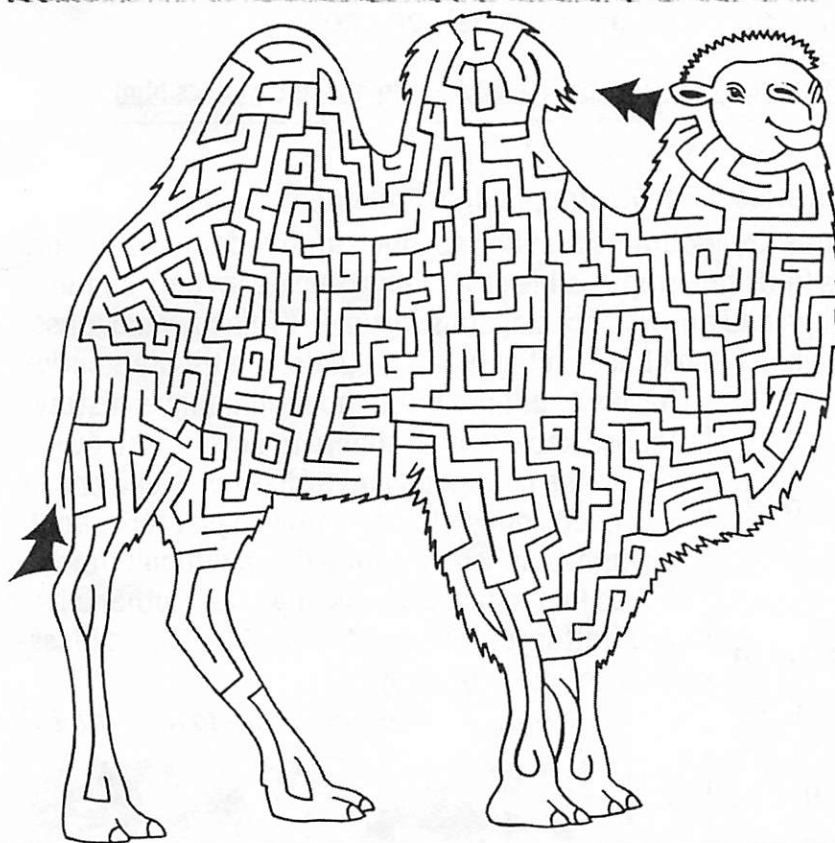


"BEST YARD" OF THE MONTH APRIL 2020 Unit # 250

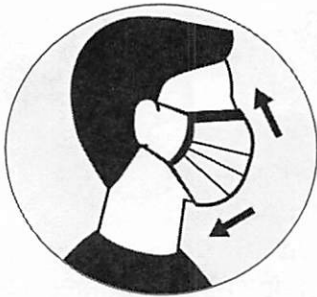

WEARING A CLOTH FACE COVERING

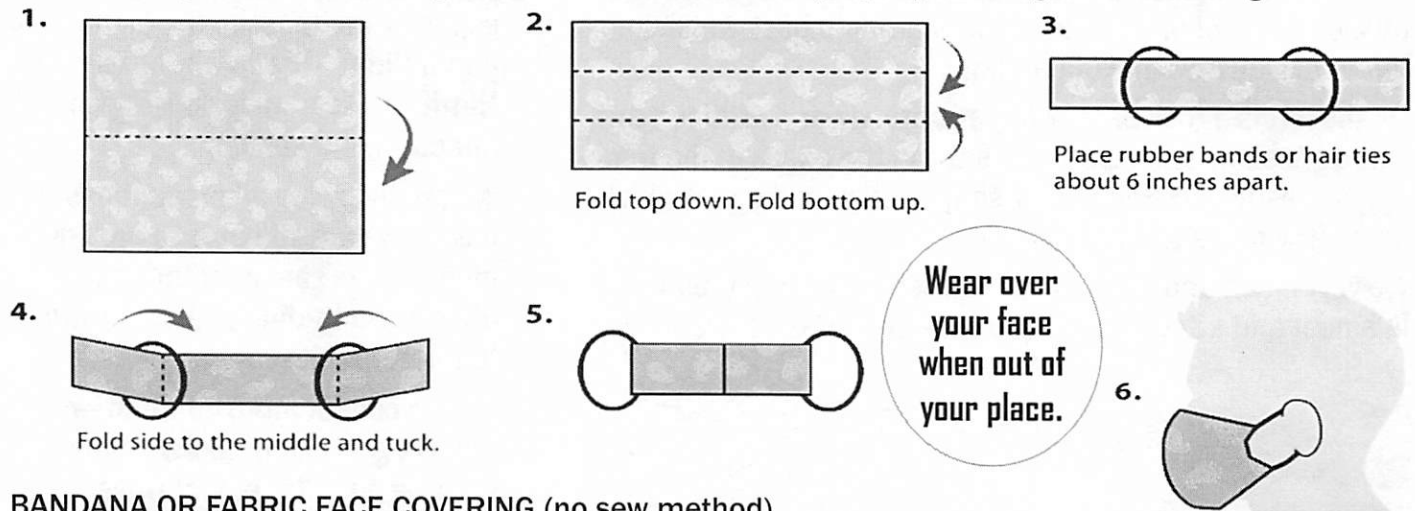
CLOTH FACE COVERINGS SHOULD—

- fit snugly but comfortably against the side of the face
- be secured with ties or ear loops
- include multiple layers of fabric
- allow for breathing without restriction
- be able to be laundered and machine dried without damage or change to shape



CLOTH FACE COVERINGS CARE

Individuals should be careful not to touch their eyes, nose, and mouth when removing their face covering and wash hands immediately after removing. Coverings should be routinely washed depending on the frequency of use. A washing machine should suffice in properly washing a face covering.



BANDANA OR FABRIC FACE COVERING (no sew method)

MATERIALS: 1. Bandana (or woven cotton cloth square approximately 20"x20")
2. Rubber bands (or hair ties)

KLCC CHAPLAIN'S MESSAGE

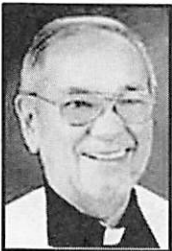
To all my brothers and sisters of the Kearney Lodge Community

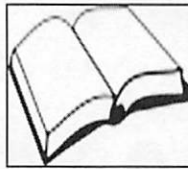
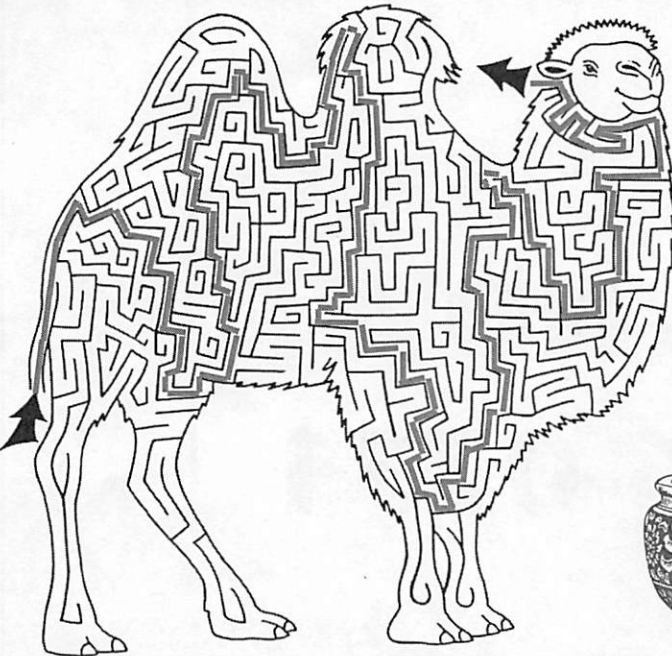


TRANSPORTATION SERVICE

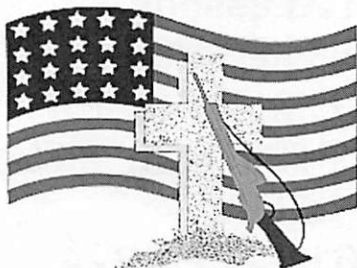

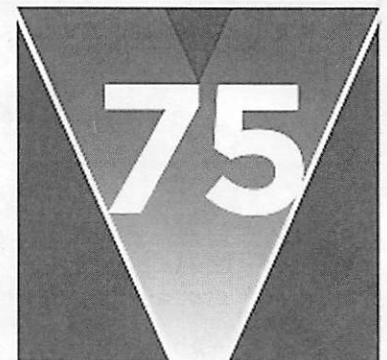
