USE A TIMER: Put your sprinkler system on a timer to avoid over-watering. Also reduce your water usage with soaker hoses and drip irrigation lines instead of overhead watering.



 - Joleen suggested a new name for the newsletter, "The Connector." Motion made and unanimously approved for the new name.
- 3. Ideas for new activities in the park
 - a. Joleen suggested a gathering where residents can show off and/or sell their hobbies or avocations (e.g., collections, art, garden clippings). October 6 was suggested as the date; Joe will check to see if the clubhouse is open. A couple names were suggested: "Show and Sell" or "Hobby Fair".
 - b. Bonnie suggested we hold a contest for naming the streets. All agreed that giving the streets different colors has not been that helpful. Joe will talk to the park mangers to see if we can do this, and maybe have a fundraiser to buy street signs. (NOTE: Everyone's address (would) remain 6460 Convoy Ct. The street names would not be official city streets, just used within the park to help visitors find us.)
 - c. Someone started a "Share box" inside the doc of the clubhouse. People can put useable, useful items in the box and anyone can take them. Joe will check with the managers to find out if we can put excess fruit from trees in the box, maybe one day per week so that anything not taken can be discarded before attracting bugs or critters.
- 4. Someone raised the question again about why we cannot get Cox or TimeWarner to cable the park. One person thought it was because AT&T had exclusive rights to the park; someone else thought it was too expensive for either company to lay the cable. Joe will ask the park managers to clarify and let us know if there is anything we can do.

KEEPING TERMITES AWAY

Termites need three things to thrive: food, moisture and shelter.

DON'T FEED THEM. Keep your gutters clean. Wet leaves provide moisture and food for the pests, and since the gutters are attached to your home, it's an easy point of entry. Clogged gutters can also contribute to moisture problems by soaking wood of the roof and fascia boards.

DON'T GIVE THEM MOISTURE. Make sure the air conditioner tank is at least four inches from your house. Don't let it leak near your house.

Dryers should vent away from the house. Warm air is moisture-saturated from dried clothes. Washers should drain away from the house, too.

Check for leaky faucets. Fix them promptly.

DON'T GIVE THEM EASY ACCESS TO SHELTER. Keep vines, flower gardens and storage containers away from your house. Make a garden path if you must have them close by. Roots feed the termites, and the leaves give the termites the moisture and shade they crave. Also, you won't be able to see the clay tubes of subterranean termites.

Check your house for stains, holes and other infestation signs.

Wings on your window sill, particularly inside the house, are a sign that you need to have home checked.

WHEN IT'S TIME FOR TREATMENT. It's best to call a professional pest control company when you have an infestation. They have the equipment and expertise necessary to do the job thoroughly. They can also check your home for potential access points. The same is true for treating infested trees in your yard.

After treatment, check your home for termites regularly. Info from: USDA Agricultural Research Service



UPDATED INFORMATION about BROWN WIDOW SPIDERS

NON-NATIVE SPECIES IS REPLACING MORE DANGEROUS BLACK WIDOWS. Now, take a deep breath. The spread of brown widows could be good news.

Newly released research suggests non-native brown widows are pushing out what researchers consider more dangerous (and native) western black widows. Most of the time, brown widows have a bite similar to that of common house-hold spiders, according to the Center for Invasive Species Research at UC Riverside, though scientists acknowledge some brown widow bites are far worse.


Richard Vetter, a retired researcher at UC Riverside said that brown widows are extremely common in urban areas, but they were never detected inside homes and rarely in sheds or garages. Vetter found brown widows in very specific types of places, particularly the ridges of plastic out-door furniture. He also found them under the lips of potted plants and garbage cans, and on recreational equipment such as bikes and diving boards.

The brown widow looks similar to immature western black widow spiders, which has smaller black spots on the top of the diagonal abdominal stripes and a more olive gray background coloration.

Here's how the Riverside research center website describes the differences: A brown widow is a mottled with tan and brown with black accent marking. In mature females, there is usually a dorsal longitudinal abdominal stripe and three diagonal stripes on each flank. At the top of each diagonal stripe, there is a black mark, which is rather squarish. The brown widow spider does have an hourglass, but it is typically an orange shade rather than the vivid red hourglass of a black widow.

Vetter and his colleagues said most commercially available insecticides should work on brown widows, and also said that reducing clutter around the house and garage should minimize nest sites. They also recommend storing garage items (such as rarely worn gloves or sports equipment) in zip-close plastic

PREVENT MOLDY BERRIES

then, Bingo

Berries are delicious, but also delicate. It seems like they mold before you even get them home from the market.

It's so very annoying to pay \$\$\$ for a pint of local berries, only to find fuzzy mold growing on them the next day – in the fridge, yet. A tip: try washing the berries with vine-gar to prevent mold:

When you get your berries home, prepare a mixture of one part vinegar and ten parts water. Dump the berries into the mixture and swirl around. Drain, rinse if you want (the mixture is so dilute that you can't taste the vinegar,) and then pop in the fridge.

The vinegar kills mold spores and bacteria on the surface of the fruit. Raspberries may last a week or more, and strawberries may last ten days without getting moldy and soft.

So stock up on those wonderful berries, knowing that now you can keep them fresh as long as it takes you to eat them.

Oh, and you're berry welcome!
