SAVING LIGHT

Daylight Saving Time is a time cycle that starts in the early spring when we set our clocks ahead one hour. Because the sun rises so early in the spring and summer months, setting our clocks ahead by an hour gives us more daylight in the evening. In the fall, the exact opposite happens — we set our clocks back an hour (to Standard Time) to gain that extra hour of sunlight in the morning, so we don't go to school or work in the dark.

Daylight Saving Time has proven to save on energy because people don't turn on lights, heat, etc. as early as they would have, if their clocks had not been turned back.

Not until World War I did countries start to think of observing Daylight Saving Time. The practice of switching the time around has been a muddle ever since. For years after WWI, the U.S. government let individual states and cities decide if they wanted to observe Daylight Saving Time because it originally angered so many people. At the time, many Americans were farmers used to getting up early and going to bed early as well. An hour of extra light at night wouldn't do them any good. It wasn't until the mid-1970s that an official law on the matter was passed. Hawaii and Arizona still do not observe Daylight Saving Time.

In 2005, the U.S. government passed a bill that changed the way we observe Daylight Saving Time, yet again. Beginning in 2007, Daylight Saving Time starts on the second Sunday in March, and ends the first Sunday in November.

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MY PERSONAL OBSERVATIONS ABOUT THE 5-MPH SPEED LIMIT INSIDE KEARNEY LODGE MOBILE HOME PARK

From the start I want to declare that I support 100% the joint efforts made by the Park Management and the Kearney Lodge Community Connection to make the Park safer by encouraging all of us to slow down when driving. That being said, I want to state that this initiative has many challenges, and I'm also very aware of MANY violators of this policy.

I never attended any of the meetings about this issue, but I followed with great interest the written reports about the development and adaptation of this policy. When I purchased my home in early 2013, I became aware that some residents were more mindful than others about slowing down while driving in the Park. I was very happy that signs have been posted and as a result more residents and visitors are trying to slow down. I try to "slow down" too. But it's not easy.

Sometimes I find myself thinking about where I'm going when leaving the Park, or about all the things I need to do at home when I'm returning to the Park. I'll look down at my speedometer and find myself driving faster than I should! How could I be "speeding"? It's because I'm not paying attention to my driving even though I'm trying to drive slowly? My speedometer starts at 10 MPH. It seems like I have to apply the brake every 20-30 seconds to stay under the lowest posted speed in my car. I'm guilty of driving faster than I intend to be driving even though I agree with the policy. Is it only me, or is this a challenge for everyone? I don't know, but it's worth mentioning so all of us can check our own driving habits.

I am aware of MANY continual violators of this policy. I live next to one of the many speed bumps in the Park. I hear sounds of vehicles that seem to "jump" over the bump. When I take the time to look out my windows or front door, I see many commercial vehicles, such as the FEDEX trucks and the UPS Delivery truck moving faster than they should. Are they moving too fast because they are on a time limit to make ALL of their deliveries on time? Or is it more difficult for them to slow down their larger vehicles? I don't know. I see other Home Repair or Installation trucks and vans driving too fast. I also observe the Paramedics and Fire Trucks moving faster than 5 MPH when they are responding to calls inside the Park. Is this necessary? Is this legal? I don't know, but I ask myself these questions.

The last groups of violators I observe fall into two main categories that are often combined together:

A) Younger drivers (ages 16-30 by my guess) and mainly male, and

B) Vehicles with lifted suspensions such as Pick-up trucks, Vans and other ATV's (All Terrain Vehicles).

In my observation, not all of these drivers are Park residents. However some of them do live here, but they aren't usually the Home Owners nor do their vehicles represent the ONLY vehicle I see parked in their driveways.

Finally, to be very clear, I'm not a law enforcement officer. I don't take down vehicle descriptions or license plate numbers. I don't take pictures or videos of drivers or vehicles. I'm only a casual but very interested home owner and observer. I'm watching myself first and others second. I want ALL residents and PEDESTRIANS to feel safe inside the Park. These are my observations. Please don't take offense. But if you see yourself or a family member in these observations, PLEASE think about how you can help make this Park a safer place.

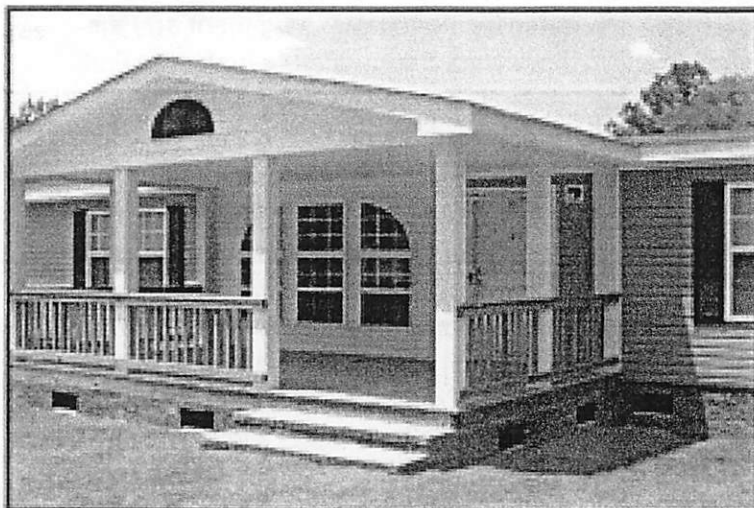

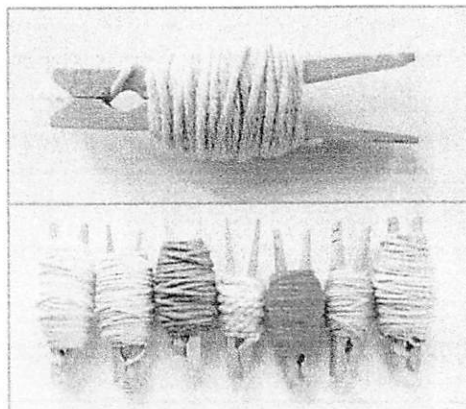
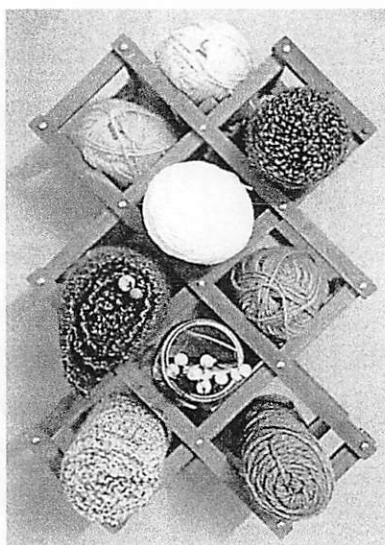

FOR THE YARN YOU KEEP

Here's a storage idea for the yarn you'll use this year. Hung as shown, it can store nine skeins; turned on its side, 10 skeins can be stored.

For little bits of leftover yarn from your crochet projects, here is an easy idea. Gather the bits of yarn, wind them around wooden clothespins, and clip the loose end in the mouth of the clothespin. Wooden clothespins seem to hold the yarn better than plastic ones because they have a little texture to them. Put your small bits of yarn into an interesting container, such as a decorated box or basket.

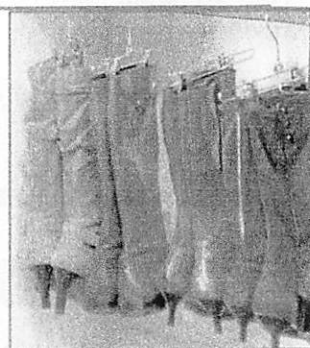

Use clip hangers to hang your boots. This will keep them from flopping over.

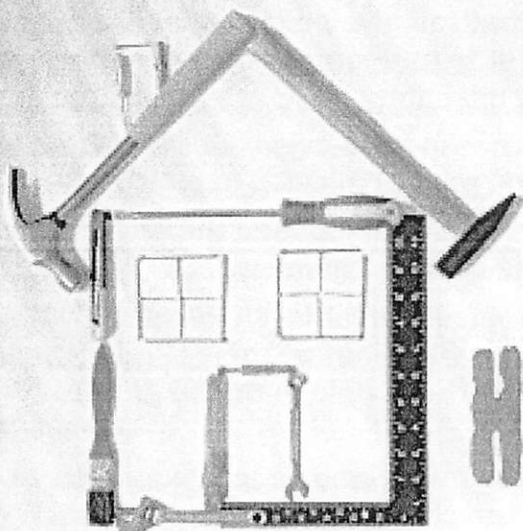

NATURAL WAYS TO KEEP SLUGS OUT OF YOUR GARDEN

Slugs are in almost every garden. You can purchase commercial slug poison but it isn't very effective especially after a rain when slugs are the most active. Consider using a natural method of slug control.

- Don't water in the evening. Slugs are most active at night. Water just before sunrise. The ground will have all day to dry out.
- Small Strips of Copper Wire placed around vegetable plants or above-ground containers will help to keep the slugs off; use plain copper wire with the coating removed.
- A commercial copper mesh Slug Shield goes around the base of vegetable plants and keep slugs off the garden veggies. If a slug touches the copper mesh, it receives a mild shock and then keeps away from the plant.
- Fill small saucers with beer and set them around the garden. The slugs will climb into the beer and drown. Discard the slugs in the morning and refill the saucers .
- Add a pint of minced fresh garlic to a gallon of water and allow it to set for 24 hours. Spray around your vegetable plants after sun-down to repel the slugs.
- Sprinkle some salt on each slug which will quickly kill it; then clean up the slugs.
- Mix a quart of ammonia into a gallon of water and fill a good water pistol with this solution. After dark, when the slugs are most active go out with a strong flashlight and spray the ammonia solution directly onto the slugs.
- Get the rough type of Diatomaceous Earth to sprinkle around your garden and individual plants. It will also get rid fleas, ticks, and caterpillars.
- Put a ring of coffee grounds around each plant to keep away the slugs.

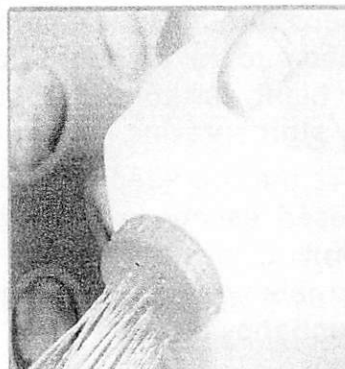

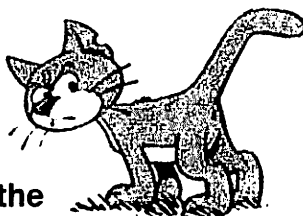

CONSIDER THE TOM CAT
