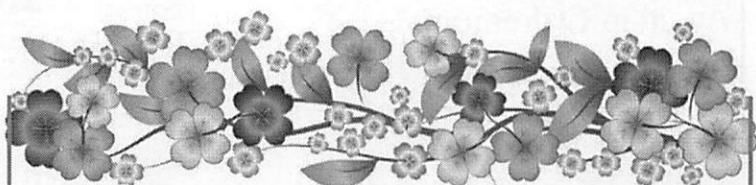

In Memory of Silvia Esposito

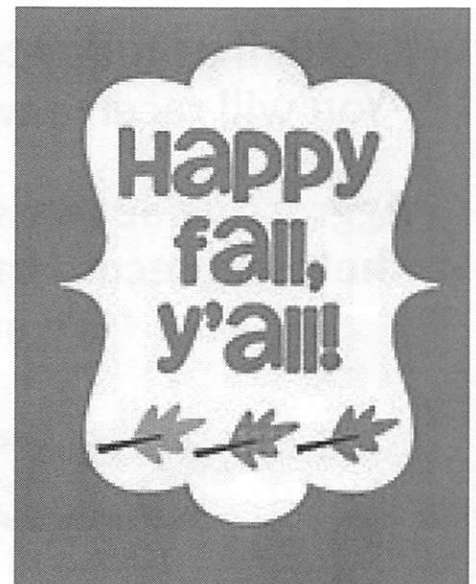
Horried, she asked if I ended up in intensive care, because the dog food poisoned me. I told her no, I stopped to pee on a fire hydrant and a car hit me.

AMERICAN FLAG ETIQUETTE

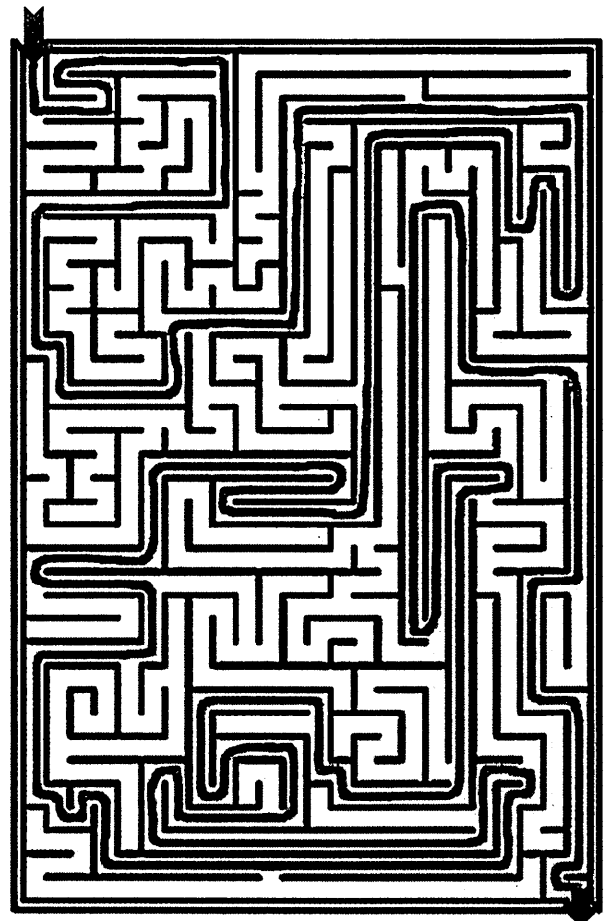
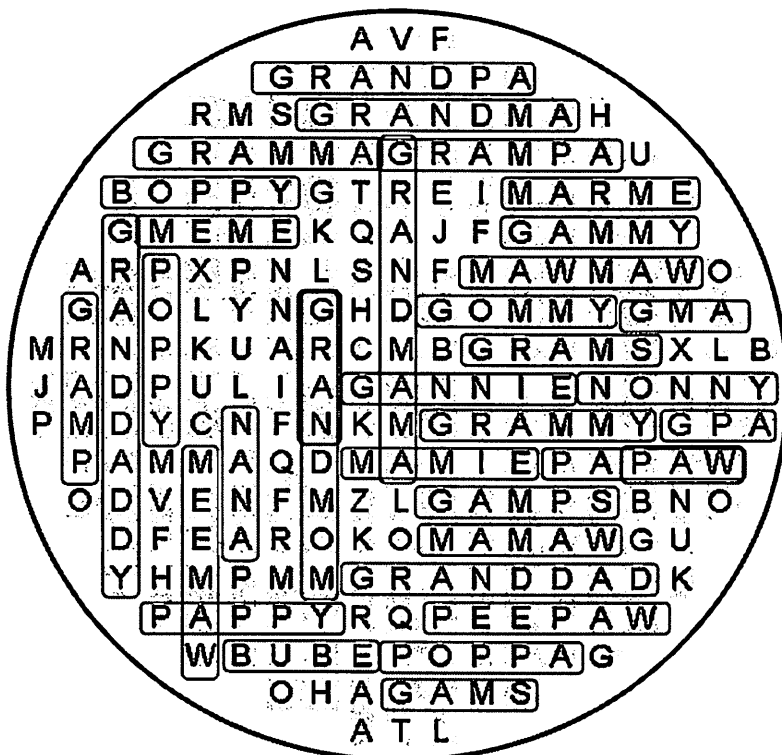
As part of the United States Code, the United States Flag Code sets out the rules about the national flag. It serves as a guide for proper American flag etiquette.

Here's a summary of the American flag display etiquette for civilians, according to the code:

- The flag should be hoisted briskly and lowered ceremoniously.
- Display the flag from sunrise to sunset. If the flag is displayed 24 hours a day for patriotic effect, it must be properly illuminated in darkness.
- Display on all days, but especially New Year's Day, Inauguration Day, Martin Luther King Jr.'s birthday, Lincoln's birthday, Washington's birthday, Easter Sunday (variable), Mother's Day, Armed Forces Day, Memorial Day (half-staff until noon), Flag Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Constitution Day, Columbus Day, Navy Day, Christmas Day. (Plus, other days proclaimed by the president, birthdays of states (date of admission) and state holidays).
- The union, (the blue corner with 50 stars), should be at the peak of the staff when displayed from a staff projecting from a window, balcony or building.
- When not displayed on a pole, the flag should be displayed flat, or suspended so it falls freely as though it were on a staff.
- In a group, the American flag should be at the center and highest point of a group of state flags, flags of localities, or pennants of societies.
- You can fly the American flag and the flag of another nation on two separate staffs at the same height.
