

The **California** quail (Lophortyx californica), also known as the valley quail, became the official state **bird** in 1931. A widely distributed and prized game bird, it **is** known for its hardiness and adaptability.

On March 2, 1903 the **California poppy** (Eschscholzia californica), became the official state **flower** of California.

The California redwood became the official state tree in 1937. There are two types: the coast redwood and the giant sequoia. The coast redwood is the tallest in the world.

The **Golden trout** (Salmo aguabonita) is a **fish** that was only found in California. It was declared as the official state fish in 1947, by the State Legislature.

FLAG OF CALIFORNIA

(CALIFORNIA STATE FLAG)
Official State Flag of California

Designed by William Todd (nephew of Mary Todd Lincoln, wife of Abraham Lincoln), the



historic bear flag was raised at Sonoma, California in 1846 by American settlers in revolt against Mexican rule (officially adopted as the state flag of California in 1911).

SYMBOLS ON CALIFORNIA'S FLAG: The once common California grizzly bear (also the official state animal) portrays strength; the star represents sovereignty; the red color signifies courage; and the white background stands for purity.

THE BEAR FLAG REVOLT: On June 14, 1846,

a small band of settlers marched on the

Mexican garrison at Sonoma and took the commandant prisoner. They issued a proclamation
which declared California to be a Republic
independent of Mexico. This uprising became

known as the *Bear Flag Revolt* (after the hastily-designed flag depicting a grizzly bear and a five-pointed star over a red bar and the words "California Republic."

Taking a cue from the Sonoma revolt in 1846, the state again decided to make the California Grizzly the flag's focal point. Only this time they wanted a bear that actually looked like a bear. Illustrators used the recently deceased Monarch as the model for the bear on our state flag.

The grizzly bear (now extinct in California) was a symbol of great strength while the star made reference to the *Lone Star of Texas*. The flag only flew until July 9, 1846 when it was learned that Mexico and the United States were already at war. Soon after, the Bear Flag was replaced with the American flag. It was adopted as the State Flag by the State Legislature in 1911.

The **Desert tortoise** (Gopherus agassizi) is the state **reptile** since 1972. It is found in the southwestern desert areas. This species lives there as a protected species now. It is endangered in the wild because of habitat loss and natural predators like coyotes, roadrunners, gila monsters, badgers, and ravens. This species was one of the main reasons for passing the California Desert Protection Act.

10 DROUGHT-RESISTANT FLOWERS
