KEARNEY LODGE COMMUNITY CONNECTION MEETING of November 8, 2012

Joe Beatty called the meeting to order at 7:03 PM, and welcomed many residents new to the meeting.

HOUSEKEEPING CONCERNS:

1. There were no responses so far to the ad in the newsletter asking for a volunteer to seek local business ads for the newsletter.

2. Joe reminded everyone to speak one at a time.

COMMITTEE REPORT:


1. Block Captains:

a. All disaster preparedness packets have been distributed. The park will be asked to give out packets to new residents since block captains are not informed of new residents.

b. The disaster preparedness speaker could not attend this month; Bonnie will invite him to the January meeting instead.

2. Street Naming:

a. There were more residents present at this meeting; some expressed the following concerns about the street naming process.



ii. Another question was raised about why the order of names for the North-South streets had beenchanged. It was explained that this was a decision by the committee members who vol-unteered to reduce the more than 300 names down to 4 for each street. In particular, the de-cision was made to have Kearney switched from the longest N-S street to the street that passes in front of the offices as this is the name of the park and it seemed fitting to have it be the name of the street where the office is found—IF this was the group of names that was chosen.

iii. Several members present for the first time thanked those residents who have been regular attendees at these meetings for the work they have put into this and other projects. Joe and Wendy encouraged those who were here for the first time to consider coming more often so they can be a part of discussions about KLCC business from the start.

iv. Joe announced that the park will not put suffixes (e.g., Street, Avenue) on the "street" signs as these could be confused with actual city streets. [Reminder: These will be internal names only, and will not be part of the city of San Diego street names. Everyone's address will continue to be 6460 Convoy Court, with individual space numbers.]

v. Twenty three ballots were collected and tabulated after the meeting by Joe and Wendy; two streets received tie votes, which were broken by having those residents still present to vote again for the tied names.

b. The [street] names will be as follows (# of votes are in parentheses):

i. North-South streets will be called West; Main; Central; and East (8)

ii. [Cross street will be:] A=Applewood (8); B=Bluebird (8); C=Carefree (9); D=Diamond (12); E=Emerald (11); F=Flamingo (13); G=Gardenia (5 + tiebreaker vote); H=Hummingbird (7 + tiebreaker vote); I=Iris (8); J=Jasmine (10); K=Kiwi (8); L=Lavender (11) (Continued on Page 8.)

KLCC MEETING of 1 OCT 2012 - Continued

OLD BUSINESS:

 Transportation: One request for transportation to the polls was received and filled. Remember, you can contact Ellen if you need help.

2. The park cannot publish a list of local services. However, the KLCC can do so, with the recommendation that we include more than one of each type of service so a list would not be seen as an endorsement. The list could be distributed by newsletter, block captains, or kept in the clubhouse for pickup. This can be addressed further at the next meeting as it would require at least one volunteer to create the list, and a decision re: how to distribute.

3. The park suggested that someone who cannot reach the pool magnet closure [latch] ask for assistance (call ahead, or ask office secretary when she is present). It was also suggested that perhaps someone who could not reach could bring along a stick to lengthen his or her reach.

4. The asphalt condition is probably no worse than our city streets and the cost of replacing it with concrete would likely be prohibitive and/or be passed on to residents via increased space fees. Those present agreed that the best solution is to carry a flashlight to use when walking the park after dark. Someone also stated that the park was built on a landfill and that no matter what is done, there would always be sinkage. Joe will check this out with the park managers as there was some disagreement about whether or not this was factual.

NEW BUSINESS:

 Suggestion box items: a. A resident asked whether or not an electric car can be owned by park residents (i.e., are there any restrictions for plugging in the car, especially if it would require a cord from the car to the residence). Joe will ask the managers.

b. A resident asked whether others are having difficulty with flickering lights or dimming of lights when a nearby resident is using a power tool. The consensus of those present is that anyone with such problems should contact the park directly and/or contact an electrician to make sure that their electrical system is not compromised with the potential for starting an electrical fire.

c. Bonnie reminded residents they can get a free inspection from SDG&E, but this inspection is designed to make sure that your heating system [& other gas appliances] is/are clean and burning properly if it uses gas,

and to offer energy saving tips and products.

2. Other discussion items included:

- a. A resident asked if others were having problems with the In-park cable system (channels fading in and out frequently). Several have had this problem for months; several have had difficulty getting through to the Swift Communications company that runs the service. A second number that goes directly to the serviceman will be placed in the newsletter next month. [SEE PAGE 3.]
- Raffle drawing was held for the \$18 that was collected.
 The winner's name will not be published.
- c. Next meeting is December 13 from 7:00 to 8:00 pm. Come by and wish your neighbors a happy holiday season AND be part of whatever projects come up. [NOTE: A potluck is held every odd month at 6:30 pm.]
- d. Meeting adjourned near 8:00 PM





MAKE FLOWER POT PENS


MATERIALS: - 6-10 artificial flowers

- Small clay flower pot (4-in diameter)
- · 1 Roll of green florists tape Craft ribbon
- Pens (one per flower stem) Cardboard Glue
 2 Cups dried beans, pebbles or aquarium rocks

INSTRUCTIONS:

Cut a circle of cardboard to fit the bottom of the flower pot to cover the hole; then glue in place. Fill the pot about half way full with beans or

pebbles. Use florists tape to fasten the pen (with the point facing away from the flower petal) to the flower stem; make sure the pen cap will fit after taping. Wrap craft ribbon around the flower pot and secure with glue. Arrange flower pens in pot.
