

CHICKEN AND RICE

1 can Cream of Mushroom soup

1 can Cream of Chicken soup

1 can Cream of Celery soup

½ Cup Butter

1 1/4 Cup uncooked rice

6-8 pieces bone in chicken

Melt the butter in 9 x 13 Pan. Add the rice and all three cans of soup. Mix well and spread evenly in the pan. Place the chicken pieces on top of the rice mixture. Splash with cooking sherry, cover with foil sprayed with Pam and bake at 250 degrees for 2½ hours. Uncover during the last 45 minutes to allow the chicken to brown.

This is a recipe my mom made when entertaining, and often on Sundays. You do not spend a lot of time in the kitchen and it is very tasty.





HOW TO PREVENT HEAT STROKE IN DOGS

Hot summer weather can be more dangerous to dogs than many pet owners realize. When a dog's temperature gets too high, they can



suffer a potentially fatal heat-stroke. To keep your dog cool, make sure that they have plenty of water and shade. When walking your dog, you may want to use a cooler, shadier trail. Driving with dogs presents its own risks, and whether going to the store or a long distance, make sure your dog has all they need for the journey. Never leave a dog in a car alone.

COOLING DOWN YOUR DOG

- · Trim but do not shave their coat.
 - · Leave a water bowl outside.
 - Give dogs plenty of shade.
 - Avoid tying your dog outside for long periods of time.
 - Cool down the dog if they exhibit signs of heatstroke,

WALKING AND EXERCISING WITH YOUR DOG

- Go out during the cooler hours. Early morning and late evening hours will be much cooler than midday. It is recommended that you walk your dog during these hours to avoid the worst of the heat.
- Walk your dog on soft ground. Asphalt can get dangerously hot during the summer, burning your dog's paws and increasing their temperature. Asphalt can retain 90% of the sun's heat. Instead of walking on sidewalks or especially blacktop, try to find dirt trails or grassy areas where you can walk your dog.
- · Carry a collapsible water dish.
 - Rest in shady areas.
 - · Watch for signs of overheating.

DRIVING WITH YOUR DOG

- · Equip your car with window shades.
 - Give your dog water breaks.
 - Put the air conditioner on. If your A/C does not work, you can also crack a window while the car is moving. Do not let your dog stick their head out of the window.
 - Never leave your dog unattended in a vehicle.



TREE STUMP


For yards that have a tree stump or two in the way, those

THE BOMB

WHEN: July 16, 1945

WHERE: White Sands, in the desert about 60 miles NW of Alamogordo, New Mexico.

QUESTION: This date marks the 75th Anniversary of what significant event in

the history of the world?

ANSWER: The first atomic bomb was successfully detonated, bringing in the atomic age.

The Manhattan Project was the code name for the secret, large-scale WW II project that developed the first atomic bomb. While this

project had been going on for several years, President Truman knew nothing about it until he succeeded President Roosevelt upon FDR's death in April 1945. At the time, the U.S. was still fighting Japan which showed no willingness to surrender.

Now, President Truman had to make a huge decision. Should we use the second bomb to destroy an entire Japanese city? Well, he showed little hesitation in using the new mega-weapon, and the rest is history. More about this in our August issue.
