

PREVENTING JET SKI ACCIDENTS

The best weapon against jet ski accidents and other personal watercraft accidents is knowledge. Indeed, most serious jet ski accidents occur when the rider is someone who has either borrowed or rented the jet ski. In other words, unfamiliarity with the technique and etiquette of riding a jet ski can endanger your health! By staying informed about the risks associated with jet skis, you can minimize your chances of being involved in an accident.

For instance, it is important to know that the vast majority of jet ski accidents involve a collision with another vessel. This indicates that too few jet ski operators are remaining vigilant and alert while out on the water. Besides inattention, there are a few other common causes of jet ski accidents, each of which is avoidable with a little care and experience. For example, too few jet ski operators know the limitations of their craft in terms of speed and stopping distance. Many riders assume that a jet ski can stop abruptly, when in fact it takes considerable time and disance to bring a personal watercraft to a complete halt.

Another common cause of jet ski accidents is ignorance of the relation between power and steering in a jet ski. When the engine of a jet ski is off, the vessel will continue to travel in the same direction regardless of which way the handlebars are turned. In other words, a jet ski can-not be steered when the power is off.

There are also a number of common "tricks" that are for-bidden by law because they increase the potential for danger. In almost every jurisdiction in the United States, it is illegal to do the following things on a jet ski: make sharp turns near another vessel; jump another vessel's wake within 100 feet of that or any other vessel; follow a boat too closely; and chase another jet ski in small circles. All of these activities, especially combined with inexperience and inattention, can result in serious or fatal accidents.





THOMAS JEFFERSON April 13, 1743 – July 4, 1826

- At 5, began studying under his cousins' tutor.
- At 9, studied Latin, Greek and French.
- At 14, studied classical literature and additional languages.
- At 16, entered the College of William and Mary.
- At 19, studied Law for 5 years starting under George Wythe.
- At 23, started his own law practice.
- At 25, was elected to the Virginia House of Burgesses.
- At 31, wrote the widely circulated "Summary View of the Rights of British America" and retired from his law practice.
- At 32, was a Delegate to the Second Continental Congress.
- At 33, wrote the Declaration of Independence.
- At 33, took three years to revise Virginia's legal code and wrote a Public Education bill and a statute for Religious Freedom.
- At 36, was elected the second Governor of Virginia, succeeding Patrick Henry.
- At 40, served in Congress for two years.
- At 41, was the American minister to France and negotiated commercial treaties with European nations along with Ben Franklin and John Adams.
- At 46, served as the first Secretary of State under George Washington.
- At 53, served as Vice President and was elected president of the American Philosophical Society.
- At 55, drafted the Kentucky Resolutions and became the active head of Republican Party.
- At 57, was elected the third president of the United States.
- At 60, obtained the Louisiana Purchase doubling the nation's size.
- At 61, was elected to a second term as President.
- At 65, retired to Monticello.
- At 80, helped President Monroe shape the Monroe Doctrine.
- At 81, almost single-handedly created the University of Virginia and served as its first president.
- At 83, died on the 50th anniversary of the Signing of the Declaration of Independence, as did John Adams

Thomas Jefferson knew, because he himself studied the previous failed attempts at government. He understood actual history, the nature of God, his laws and the nature of man. That happens to be way more than what most understand today. Jefferson really knew his stuff.

"But I'm God. I have everything left over."


"Then I'll have a little of everything, please."

HOW TO MAKE A TERRARIUM

Gardens Under Glass

Modern terrariums offer a stress-reducing window on nature. They are the perfect project for apartment dwellers who have small spaces, or those who just don't have the time to care for a full-sized garden.

A well-designed terrarium brings the outdoors in downsized into a jar. Take what you love in a garden - the plants, textures, the closeness to nature - and shrink them. Terrariums are small in stature, but they make a big impact.

A closed terrarium acts like a biosphere, sealing in moisture and drastically reducing watering duties. Select plants that thrive in high humidity, low light and abundant moisture; plant them in a glass jar; give them an initial drink; and your terrarium is good to go for weeks on end.


A terrarium can be inexpensive. Check your storage for an old fishbowl or cookie jar that not being used. Or scout the local flea market or antique store for a unique plant container.

Find a container with enough height to give the plants growing headroom. Test the mouth of the container to make sure your hand can fit in (and out) during planting and maintenance. Beyond those parameters, anything goes - aquariums, glass teapots, apothecary jars, canning jars, lemonade dispensers, you find it! Mix and match lids, or use a glass plate as a cover.

Best of all, these small worlds are relaxing. With a terrarium around, you can escape to a minipark anytime; that never goes out of style.

SAFETY PREPARATION BEFORE BEGINNING YARD WORK

A recent Consumer Reports poll on lawn care found that consumers are not taking all the proper precautions before mowing their lawn, according to the Outdoor Power Equipment Institute (OPEI). The trade associa-



tion issued a list of top safety measures every consumer should make to avoid unintentional injury.

People need to make certain preparations before the lawn and garden products are brought from storage. According to the OPEI, good decisions about using mowers, edgers, leaf blowers and other maintenance tools are key to yard safety. Before even turning on the equipment, consumers should:

Know how to operate the equipment. Read the operator's manual before using any power equipment. Know where the controls are and how ro use them. Follow safety instructions.

Handle gas carefully. Fill up before you start; when the engine is cold.

Dress properly for yard work, wearing substantial shoes, long pants and close-fitting clothes.

Clear up the area before you mow. Always remove stones, sticks and other objects from the area so that objects won't fly up and hit anyone. The most common injuries are from flying debris.

Wear eye protection to prevent injury from projectiles.

Wear hearing protection to prevent potentially damaging sounds from reaching your ears without eliminating the sounds you'll need to hear.

Do not let music distract you from hearing potentially important calls or seeing important hazards.

Clear the area of people and pets. Keep children indoors under adult supervision.

Always start up the mower outdoors.

Do not use alcohol, other controlled substances or medicines that impair judgment when using outdoor power equipment.

HOW TO FEED FAT AND SKINNY CATS IN THE SAME ROOM

If you live in a small place and you have multiple cats, one of whom needs to go on a diet, you may think you are out of luck.



However, with some creativity and a storage tote, you can solve the problem. Purchase a clear 40-gallon storage tote and cut a hole big enough for the skinny cat to get through but too small for the fat cat. That way the skinny cat can eat his food but the fat cat can't share.

Smooth the edges of the entry hole with sandpaper or an emery board and put about a dozen quarter-sized ventilation holes in the lid. For a more budget-friendly option, use a sturdy cardboard box of about the same size.
