On the right side of the unit is a clean concrete driveway. At the front of the home is a raised patio with multiple wind chimes. Also in front, on a clean concrete surface, there is an assortment of plants in both large and small containers. Several plants are blooming with yellow, white and purple flowers. Placed among the plants are large decorative rocks, an antique pump, a wooden wagon-wheel and a large carved wooden owl from Mexico.

On the left side, on a clean concrete surface and wood-chip base, there is a palm tree and more drought-tolerant plants (some flowering). Large and small rocks are placed among the plants, and lastly, there is a walkway made of small pavers which leads to the backyard.

COVID-19 and Your Pet

STORY AT-A-GLANCE — The current human coronavirus outbreak that originated in Wuhan, China, called COVID-19, has some pet parents worried, and others taking unnecessary and drastic measures against their animal companions.

The coronavirus that causes COVID-19 is transmitted by humans to other humans — one dog living with an infected owner in Hong Kong has been placed in quarantine due to repeated "weak positive" test results; the dog has shown no clinical symptoms.

Per the OIE World Organization for Animal Health, "There is no evidence that dogs play a role in the spread of this human disease or that they become sick. Further studies are needed to understand if and how different animals could be affected by COVID-19 virus."

There's no need for pet parents to avoid or abandon animal companions; if no one in your home has the virus, as always, wash your hands after handling your pets and include them in your emergency preparedness planning.

If someone in your household is diagnosed with COVID-19, it's wise to limit interactions with pets along with other human family members.





FROM MANAGEMENT'S APRIL 2020 BULLETIN

In an effort to mitigate the spread of COVID-19 and the related health risks that it poses to members of our community, Kearney Lodge is taking the steps outline below.

Otherwise it would be helpful if you would drop your checks through the slot in the Office door.

Dumpster Day is being postponed. We will let you know in advance when it is being rescheduled.
