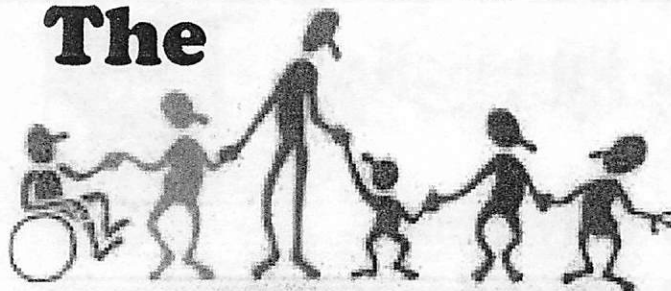

DANCERCISE



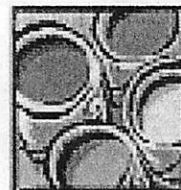

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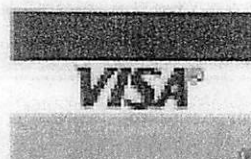

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FORTNIGHT LILY — *Diets iridioides*

I've seen lots of Fortnight lilies in the Park. Yet, there may be some (new?) residents who don't know about these sturdy plants.

Diets iridioides are evergreen perennials with spreading fans of stiff, leathery sword shaped leaves up to 2 feet in length about $\frac{3}{4}$ " wide. The upright clumps spread on creeping rhizomes and by producing seeds after the flowers.

Iris-like flowers are produced throughout spring and summer. The 3-inch flowers are white with yellow markings, and have blue to purple centers. Blooms rise above the foliage on thin 2-4 foot flower stalks. Individual flowers last only one day, but don't cut the spent flower stalks – more flowers will emerge from the same stem – even in subsequent years, so don't cut those bloom stems. They DO produce seeds. If you don't want seeds and seedlings, just snap off the flower heads.

Fortnight lilies are quite versatile; in containers, for borders, foundation plantings, or filling larger spaces. They grow well in partial shade to full sun; they have more blooms when planted in more sun. Once established, Fortnight lilies tolerate poor, dry soils, but do best in a well-drained soil with regular watering during the growing season. They are hardy in zones 8–10. Plant deep enough to cover roots, but no more than about 2 inches above the roots. Water in well and keep well-watered (daily watering) until they have recovered; about 10–14 days.

The clumps may be divided into individual 'fans' or plants, or you can leave them together to make one group. Unlike with some irises, DO NOT cut the leaves back on these plants when transplanting or dividing; this will set the plant back severely.

If you have no Fortnight lilies and would like some, you probably have neighbors nearby who would be delighted to give you some clumps. Clumps need to be divided every 3-5 years and sharing is very nice.

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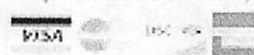
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RE-USING DRYER SHEETS

1. Add a little water to a dryer sheet and scrub away soap scum in your shower.
2. Whether you want your house or car to shine, dryer sheets will help chrome fixtures sparkle.
3. Remove static electricity from clothing, hair, TV screens, and computer monitors. Wipe the surface with a dryer sheet.
4. Dust venetian blinds. Close the blinds, then wipe up and down with a dryer sheet.
5. Use dryer sheets to freshen the air in your home. Place a few sheets in drawers, between clothes, or hang some in the closet.
6. Dryer sheets may deodorize books and photo albums that don't get opened very often.
7. Place a dryer sheet in luggage, sleeping bags, and tents before storing them for next time.
8. Tackle suitcase and gym-bag odors. Place a dryer sheet in the suitcase or gym bag so clean clothes won't take on the odors of dirty laundry.
9. Deodorize shoes and sneakers with a dryer sheet overnight.
10. Freshen a vehicle by putting a dryer sheet under the seat.
11. Also freshen laundry hampers and wastebaskets by putting a dryer sheet in the bottom.
12. Clean pet hair from the floor or furniture. Rub a dryer sheet over the spot with the unwanted fur.
13. Prevent thread from tangling when sewing. Run a threaded needle through a dryer sheet right before you begin your handiwork.
14. Loosen caked-on food from a pan. Place a fresh sheet in the bottom of a dirty pan, fill with lukewarm tap water, and let sit in the sink overnight. The pan will be easier to clean in the morning.
15. Wipe up sawdust after wood-working or building. Rub a dryer sheet over the fine wood particles.
16. Dryer sheets repel mice, ants and other pests from plants, vehicles, and foundations; even mosquitoes from you if you tuck one a sheet partially into a pocket or fasten one through a belt loop before going outdoors.

POTTED PIPE CLEANER POSIES

MATERIALS:

Colored pipe cleaners
(6 of each color)
ribbon rice
glue dots
small flower pot

INSTRUCTIONS: Start decorating your flower pot. Measure a ribbon to fit around the pot, cut the ribbon to size, and use glue dots to stick it around the pot. Tie the ribbon into a bow, and fill the pot with rice. (To color the rice green like grass, see instructions below.)

To make the flowers, lay out six pipe cleaners of the same color together, flat on the table. Determine the center of the six pipe cleaners and wrap a long, green pipe cleaner (the "stem") around the middle; the green pipe cleaner should divide the pipe cleaners in half. Twist the stem to hold the pipe cleaners together. Bend the pipe cleaners toward the center and curl them to make a flower; the ends of each colored pipe cleaner should touch the top of the green stem in the middle. Your bundle should now have six "petals." To make the stem sturdier, fold the green pipe cleaner in half again. Make more flowers and "plant" in your pot.

SUPPLIES FOR COLORING RICE:

dry white rice rubbing alcohol paper towels
green food coloring plastic zip baggie tray

INSTRUCTIONS:

Place 2-3 cups of dry rice in a plastic zip baggie. Pour in 3-4 drops of green food coloring. Pour in 1 Tablespoon of Rubbing Alcohol. Seal the bag and shake it all together. Make sure each piece of rice gets coated. Pour the colored rice onto a tray lined with paper towels to dry. Let the rice dry completely before starting to work with it again. After about 20 minutes, stir with a spoon. It should dry within an hour. Fill the flower pot with crunched up paper towels so to not use as much rice to fill it. Then add the colored green rice to the top of the pot.
