## American Flag Etiquette

There is a right way and a wrong way to display the flag. The American flag should be held in the highest regard. It represents our nation and the many people who gave their lives for our country and our flag. Here are the basics about displaying the American flag:

- The flag is normally flown from sunrise to sunset. In the morning, raise the flag briskly. At sunset, lower it slowly. Always raise and lower it ceremoniously.
- The flag should not be flown at night without a light on it.
- The flag should not be flown in inclement weather.
- After a tragedy or death, the flag is flown at half staff for 30 days.
- When flown vertically on a pole, the stars and blue field, or "union", is at the top and at the end of the pole (away from your house). The union is always on top. When displayed in print, the stars and blue field are always on the left.
- The American flag is always flown at the top of the pole. State flags and other flags fly below it. Never let your flag touch the ground, never . . . period.
- Fold your flag when storing. It should not be just stuffed in a drawer or box.
- When your flag is old and has seen better days, it is time to retire it. Old flags should be burned or buried. Please do not throw it in the trash.

There is a very special ceremony for retiring the flag by burning it. It is a ceremony everyone should see. Your local Boy Scout or VFW groups know the proper ceremony and perform it on a regular basis. If you have an old flag, give it to either group, and attend the ceremony.

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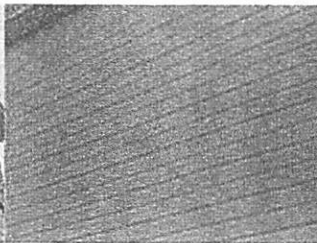

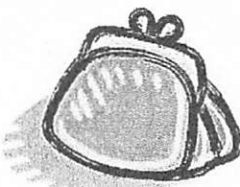
Pot luck was enjoyed by all before the meeting.

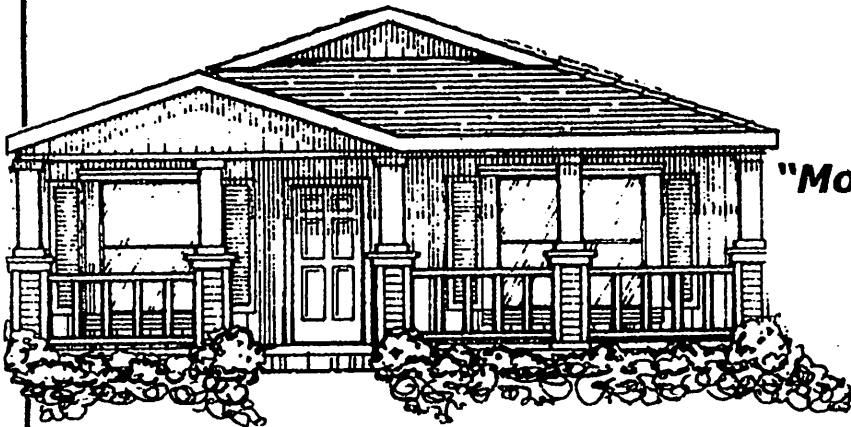


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## KLCC MEETING of 9 MAY 2013 Continued

## SEVERAL USES FOR OLD NYLONS

- Tie up floppy plants and anchor vines.
- Tie around beams or branches to hang potted plants. Sunshine will cause deterioration over time; recommended for inside home, porch, patio, or in shade.
- Tie many together and braid to make ropes.
- Line bottoms of pots so water can get out but dirt can't. This also keeps small bugs from getting inside pots from the bottom.
- Slip them over ripening fruit to protect from nibbling pests.
- Use as a sling to support heavy fruits, such as melons.
- Braid to create ropes. Sunshine will cause deterioration over time; recommended for inside home, shed or under porch/patio roofs.
- Put soap slivers inside and hang near your water faucet for easy cleanup.
- Cut in strips to use for stuffing toys. This makes them washable.
- Make play balls for the cat.
- Refill or replenish pillow stuffing with strips of old pantyhose or stockings.
- Make children's costumes. There are many ways to embellish a great costume. For example: stretch pantyhose fabric over a wire hanger and form it into angel or butterfly wings.
- Pantyhose make excellent polishing cloths and are great for shining shoes.
- Use old nylon stockings to scrub sinks and porcelain without scratching them.
- Store rolls of gift wrap, wallpaper, and posters in a stocking leg for protection.
- Store jewelry in a pantyhose leg, tying off between each item to help protect and prevent the pieces from rubbing against each other.
- Store onions or flower bulbs in a stocking leg.
- Place seed collected from vegetables in a stocking leg and hang to dry.
- Keep dust from the inside of your computer. Cut a swatch of pantyhose to size and cover the exterior cooling fan. Don't cover the power supply or processor because the fabric could melt.
- Cut around the elastic top of an old pair of pantyhose to make an extra-large rubber band. Use to:
  - ✓ hold rolled up blankets, sleeping bags, quilts . . .
  - ✓ bundle newspapers or magazines.
  - ✓ hold a bag in place in a trash can.

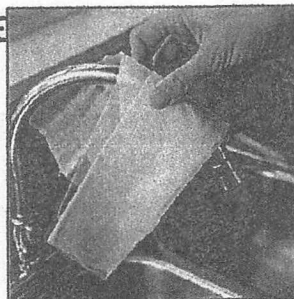

## MAKE FIXTURES SHINE

Buff faucets with wax paper to give the surface a coating that will deflect beads of moisture and temporarily minimize water spots.



## MAKE SILVER SHINE

Line a glass pan with foil, add several spoonfuls of baking soda, fill the pan with boiling water, and drop in tarnished silverware for a quick cleaning.



## BYE-BYE SQUIRRELS

Sprinkle a mix of **Cayenne Pepper** and **1 tbsp. of liquid dish soap** 1 quart of water around the problem area, and you'll say "Goodbye" to these cute, but pesky pests.

## NO MORE WHITEFLIES

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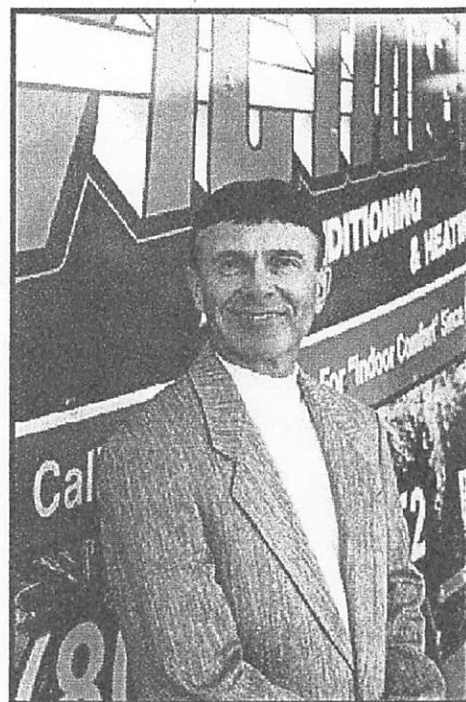

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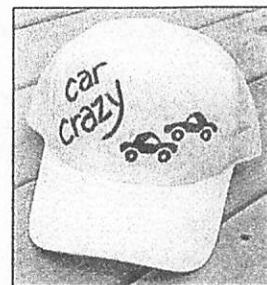
## Your "One Call" Comfort Solution!

**MAKE DAD A THEME HAT** – cars, golf, sports, or maybe fishing. Whatever your dad really likes, make him a fun, theme hat for Father's Day .

**MATERIALS:** White baseball hat, Fabric pen, Fabric paint, Foam stamp (optional) and Black permanent marker

**INSTRUCTIONS:** Draw a design on a piece of paper. If using a foam stamp, decide where to place the design before painting the stamp. Paint the foam stamp with fabric paint and press design onto the hat. If not using a stamp, paint the design directly onto the hat. Use a fabric pen or marker to write "car crazy" (or "golf crazy", "sports crazy", etc) on the hat. Use a black permanent marker to trace the letters. Use a fine paintbrush to fill in the letters to make them stand out more. Let the design dry completely; over-night is best.

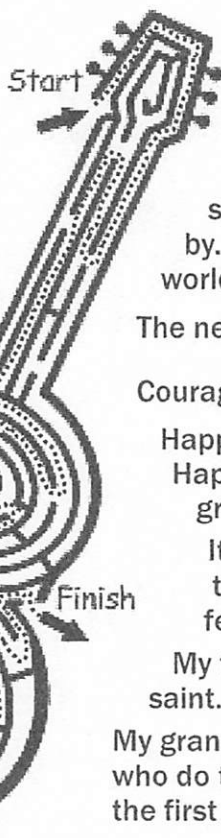
**TIPS:** To use acrylic paints instead of fabric paint, buy a bottle of textile medium, which mixed with an acrylic paint makes the acrylic paint usable on fabrics. It may be found in the art section of craft supply stores. Improvise with what you have. It is important to draw the design on paper first; or even lightly sketch it directly on the hat with a pencil before painting.

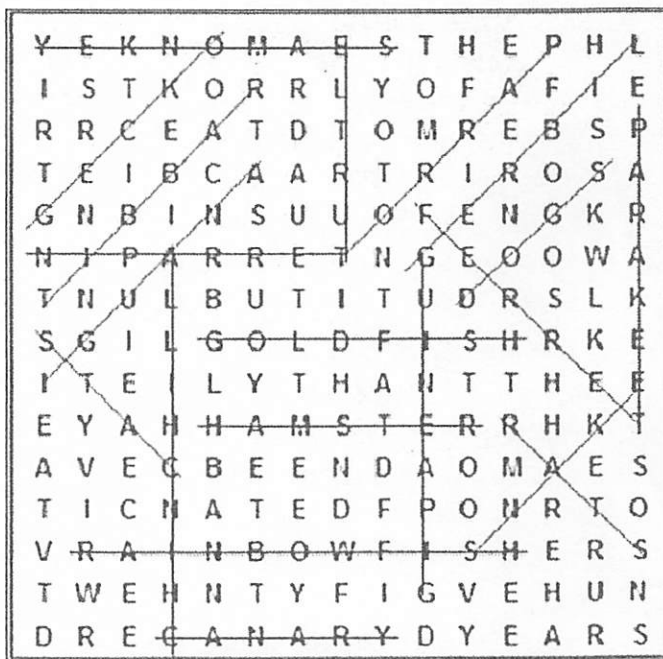
