

Joe Beatty called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

#### TREASURER'S REPORT:

#### HOUSEKEEPING CONCERNS:

1. Voluntary membership donations were accepted by the treasurer.

2. Raffle money was collected from those who wanted to participate. A (large!) chocolate Santa was offered for raffle as well.

3. Joe moved to approve the minutes from 12/8/11. Motion unanimously approved.

#### COMMITTEE REPORT:


1. Emergency Preparedness—Chair, Cheryl Clark absent. Wendy moved that if she is not at the February meeting, a new chair will be nominated.

#### OLD BUSINESS:

- 1. Rummage sale
  - a. Ellen volunteered to coordinate; Dee and Marcy will help her as needed.
  - b. Date was set as March 24, 2012, a Saturday. It is hoped this will fall on a Little League day at Hickman Field to attract more drive-by business.
- 2. Dumpster concerns
  - a. There are two dumpster days per year in the park. Next one will be in the Spring.
  - b. There is a large dumpster at the back of the park that is for park management (tree trimmings, etc.). Residents may be able to dispose of yard trimmings if they contact the front office staff.
- 3. By-laws discussion
  - a. The internet by-laws sample was reviewed and changes suggested (see copy in the front clubhouse KLMHOA Secretary's notebook on top of the bookcase). Copies will be printed and distributed by Wendy, Joe, Dee, Marcy, Ellen, and Bonnie door-to-door the week prior to our next meeting to make sure everyone in the park knows what will be voted on at the February meeting. Wendy will highlight approximately 60 homes for each volunteer to make deliveries to.
  - b. There was a suggestion made to consider changing the name of this organization from a Homeowner's Association, which implies that there is a Board of Directors with power to make park changes, to a name that indicates the primary purpose of the group in building a sense of community in the park.
    - i. Bonnie will find out what other park associations call themselves and report at the next meeting.
    - ii. Joe will research whether the name can be changed and if so, what cost would be incurred and what process is required.
    - iii. Wendy suggested something like "Kearny Lodge Mobile-home Community Association (KLMCA)."
      Others wondered if there was something less formal than the word "association."
    - iv. NAME WILL BE DISCUSSED AND VOTED ON AT FEBRUARY MEETING.

#### **NEW BUSINESS:**

- 1. Suggestion box items—there were no items in the box this month.
- 2. One Activity Suggestion was received from last month's newsletter that included the following ideas:
  - a. Meeting raffle—start with winner takes all; once participation grows, ½ would go to winner, the other ½ to support a potluck entrée with members bringing the side dishes and desserts. Not voted on.
  - b. Have a potluck before the meeting 2 or 3 times a year (suggestion adopted -see below).
  - c. Resident-entertainment offered at alternate meetings. There are piano and guitar players who may be willing to participate in a jam session, or dancers, jugglers, any other entertainers could participate. Not voted on.
- 3. New participation idea: combine next meeting with a potluck to be advertised in the next (February) newsletter and in a cover letter when the By-laws are hand-delivered to residents. (Continued on next

- 4. Joe wondered about changing the Bingo night and maybe highlighting family participation. Consensus appeared to be that Friday was the best night at this time, and no one was sure Bingo would attract families with children. Discussion tabled.
- Raffle drawing was held. Nadine won the pot of about \$6. No one participated in the chocolate Santa raffle. (The Santa was given to Nadine.)




