Ronald (Ron) Maurice was born on June 8, 1949, in the small mill town of Lawrence, Massachusetts. The grandson of French immigrants, Ron grew up in a French cultural community with his father Roland, a WW II vet, mother Antoinette, brother Roland Jr. and sister, Pat. Childhood included a strict upbringing of attending Catholic grammar school, an all-boys high school and at 18, the early passing of his mother to illness. However, Ron did not falter in his pursuit of education, receiving a bachelor degree in Civil Engineering from UMASS, Lowell in 1971. At 22, despite the country facing a recession, Ron was contracted by the U.S. Navy to move to San Diego. He sold his car, flew to San Diego (without knowing a soul) and began work as a facility planner. At first, Ron drafted drawings to remodel barracks, but by 1976, Ron was a lead engineer on many large scale building and base projects such as: the Naval Training Center, bases on North Island, the Coronado Amphibious Base, where the

Commandos trained (later named "Navy Seals") and other bases and military complexes around San Diego.

Ron retired from a successful professional career in Naval Civil Service in 2004. This freed him up to travel. Some of his favorite places he visited include: the White Mountains of New Hampshire, the rocky cost of Maine--with it's picturesque fishing villages---the California wine country and the Northern California/ Southern Oregon Redwood country.

Ron has continued to serve in civil capacity, however. He has been serving our K.L. Community since arriving here in 2012. As a charitable neighbor, Ron has served K.L. residents by offering rides to doctor appointments, grocery shopping trips and the like. He began serving on KLCC as Vice President in 2016 present, and is responsible for the "Best Yard" award article in The Connector newsletter, as well as managing the medical equipment shed here at Kearney Lodge. He also represents KLCC by attending the Neighborhood Watch bi- monthly meetings. Ron is a supportive attendee of the Friday night Bible study held in the park and he never misses an opportunity to encourage a friend or neighbor in a spiritual manner. Those of us who know him well appreciate his friendship and steadfast and dedicated support in the more important aspects of life and Christian belief.

Ron is a member of the Reformation Lutheran Church, where he participates in Sunday morning service and various other church activities. He enjoys gardening as well as lawn bowling, a fun and competitive activity played on weekends at Coronado island.

We are SO grateful to have Ron as a devoted friend, charitable neighbor and committed officer for the KLCC. He adds balance and stability to our board and membership attendees with his commitment, ideas and service to the K.L. Community. We celebrate Ron's life of dedication to God, country and contribution to our K.L. community. Thank you Ron---for being YOU!

Kearney Lodge Mobile Home Park was planned in 1963, the brainchild of several families. When the planning began, where 805 is now were ball parks. The entrance to the park was on Clairemont Mesa Blvd. and changed to Convoy Ct. when 805 was completed. With nothing around, no houses, no stores, no schools or churches, the Park was designed. There were model homes on site for new residents to select their new home from. Originally there were 300 spaces comprised of 100 family spaces and 100 age 50+ spaces. We currently have 325 spaces and are an all ages park.



Frito Hamburger Casserole

1 Onion
1 Clove of Garlic
1 ½ Pounds of Ground Beef
1 Can Cream Corn
1 Can Pitted Black Olives
1 tsp. Salt
1 Can Tomatoe Sauce
2 Cups Cheddar Cheese
2 TBL. Chili Powder

1 individual size bag of Frito's crushed
Brown the onion, garlic and ground beef. Add salt,
