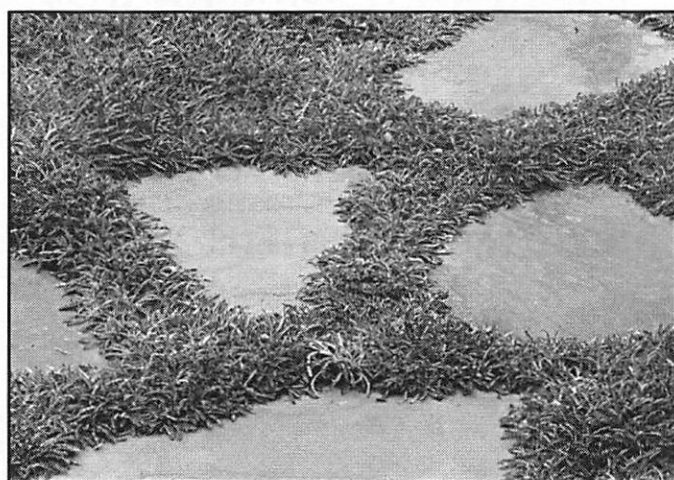

A garden of pretty perennial ground covers is attractive and can conserve water better than a traditional lawn.

Even if you replace your lawn with drought-tolerant plants, it will still need some watering — especially at first to help them establish good root systems. After that, regular rains will probably be enough to keep them hydrated. However, if there's an extended dry period it's a good idea to give drought-tolerant plants an occasional deep watering.

Use one or several groundcovers to fill in a small area where you want a prettier view, or even to create a whole new look for your yard. You could end up saving on your water bill, too!

Shown at left is Silver carpet (*Dymondia margaretae*); a perennial with approximately 1-inch, yellow flowers. It likes full sun to partial shade, and well-drained soil. It grows 2 to 4 in. tall and 18 to 20 in. wide, and can be increased with cuttings. The hardiness factors are: cold-hardy in zones 9 to 11 and heat-tolerant in AHS zones 11 to 1.

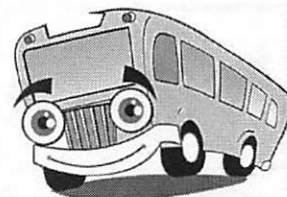

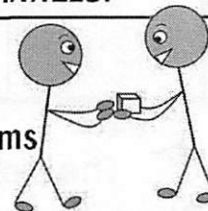
