- 2. Fall rummage sale: September 21, 7:00 am to 1:00 pm; sign up in the office; a KLCC table will be avail-able for donated items to sell.
- 3. Safe driving—Joe distributed some temporary 5 MPH cards to members who requested them; he is looking into getting larger self-stick labels for he next printing.
- 4. Bylaw change Wendy reminded members that the proposal to change elections from August to January will be voted on at the OCT 10 KLCC meeting.
- 5. Vertical Hanging Sign the Park managers expressed concern that such a sign might distract drivers entering the Park or backup traffic. Joe has been posting information in the laundry rooms and on the bulletin board outside the front office.

**6.Joe asked members to confirm whether or not to continue the following Park events:** 

- Sundays: we will continue shuffleboard for one more month. Maybe team competition or prizes would increase attendance? No motions were made.

- Fridays: Bingo


#### **OLD BJSINESS Continued**

7. Joe will host a Halloween party at his residence this year.

#### **NEW BUSINESS:**

- 1. Board member elections: members present unanimously approved the slate of candidates as follows: Joe Beatty, President; Dara Dobbins, Vice President; Nadine Mein, Treasurer. The position of secretary remains open as one per-son who was nominated declined to serve, and the other person who was nominated was not in attendance. A decision was made to ask for rotating volunteers at future meetings.
- 2. Suggestion received by phone: one resident expressed her belief that the KLCC was wasting time and money on naming our streets and should be helping residents instead, dealing with Swift Communication problems. She had complained to the Park about the company and was reportedly told that this was KLCC business. She was invited to come to this meeting, but was not present. Joe will follow up with the Park managers as no one at this meeting was aware that KLCC has any authority with regard to Swift, which is a business that rents space in the Park. He will speak with them the Monday after this meeting so he can get the response to Joleen in time for publication in the next newsletter.
- 3. Suggestions from the floor -
- Members present wonder what would help bring more residents to meetings and Park events. Joleen has asked for input in "The Connector", with no responses. There were 16 members present at this meeting. Other discussion revolved around the frustration of those attending trying to create an active KLCC, especially when the suggestion box and calls contain anonymous complaints from those sitting on the side-lines. Everyone present is giving up their free time to participate and would like some help and appreciation, not just complaints.
- Members are reminded to read the minutes in the newsletter or Clubhouse to find out what has and has not been done. Joe reported again that the area for the dog-walk is "co-owned" by the Park and the city and the Park managers are collaborating with the city to improve that area outside the Park.
