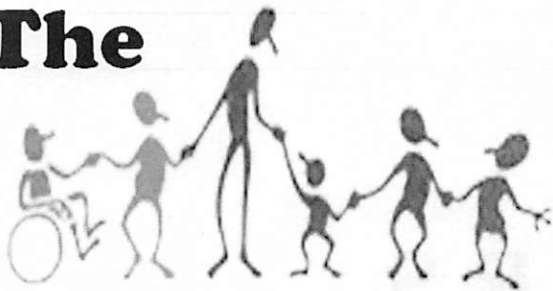

Unit 120**



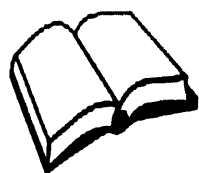
Our Best Yard winner featured in October is #120 adjacent to the east-west pedestrian walk. This is a good example of transformed appearance from bad to good, thanks to new ownership.

Both the unit and shed now have a new, matching paint job. On the left side of what had been a weed-infested area is now a newly-paved uncovered patio with new outdoor furniture. In the front of the patio are two potted hibiscus bushes; one red-flowered and one yellow-flowered.

Definitely the main, eye-catching feature at the front of the unit is a raised planter area. The border is white rock and white stone flat slabs. The planter includes four small Italian cypress trees, two potted palms, two large pots with various desert plants, a rock and earth base, and a striking row of alternating Celosia plants with bright, red and gold-flowers.

Home and yard upkeep and maintenance is a never-ending job. We really appreciate the owners who take the time and effort to keep everything clean and attractive.

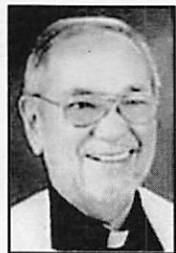

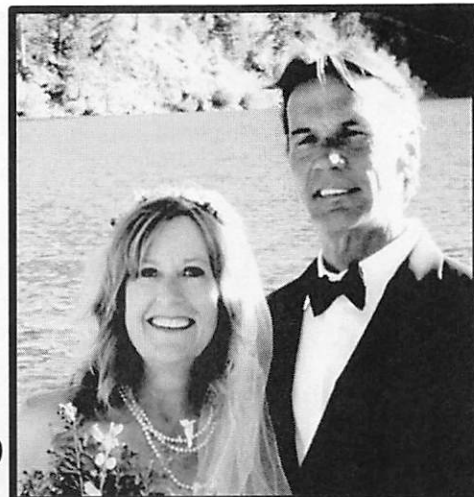

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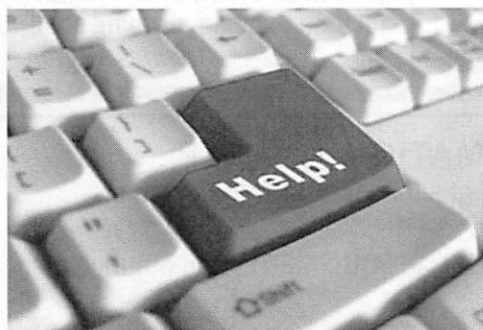
