





A FEW WORDS REGARDING THE 5 MPH SPEED LIMIT IN KEARNEY LODGE

A Resident's contribution to consider.

Occasionally a resident will complain about kids playing in the streets of Kearney Lodge. The complaint is valid and thoughtful, in fact, it demonstrates a genuine concern for the children of our residents. And the complaint in itself makes the case for the five-mile per hour speed limit here in the Park.

First of all, it was only this past summer when a driver came into contact with a playing child. Fortunately, there was no injury, but it sheds light on a fact of Kearney Lodge life.

Secondly, the children have no other place to play or ride their bikes than in and around the streets near where they live. There is no playground or other facility that would allow the kids to fulfill their job description as players. And most of the tiny yards behind our houses don't have enough space for even a Ping-Pong table.

Also, it is quite uplifting to see some of our young ones actually playing outside and getting exercise instead of sitting in from of computer games during all their free time. Some may suggest that the kids go over to Hickman Field, a trip that requires crossing the busy and hastily-travelled Hickman Field Road. The danger there is fifty times that of the streets of our own neighbor-hood, and no parents would feel at ease watching their child head off to run that gauntlet.

And speaking of being at ease, rolling along in your car at 5 mph is a chance to relax before — or after being in the rat race out there beyond the place we call home.

The five-mile an hour speed limit is not so much a command as it is an appeal to everyone who drives through Kearney Lodge to think of ourselves as custodians of the Park's children as well as protectors or our own and everyone else's safety.






