Presidents Day is an American holiday celebrated on the third Monday in February; in 2019 it occurs on Monday, February 18. Originally established in 1885 in recognition of President George Washington, the holiday became popularly known as Presidents Day after it was moved as part of 1971's Uniform Monday Holiday Act. While several states still have individual holidays honoring the birthdays of Washington, Abraham Lincoln and other figures, Presidents Day is now popularly viewed as a day to celebrate all U.S. presidents, past and present.

The shift from Washington's Birthday to Presidents Day began in the late 1960's, when Congress proposed a measure known as the Uniform Monday Holiday Act. This law sought to shift the celebration of several federal holidays from specific dates to a series of predetermined Mondays.

The proposed change was seen by many as a novel way to create more three-day weekends for the nation's workers, and it was believed that ensuring holidays always fell on the same weekday would reduce employee absenteeism. Some argued that shifting holidays from their original dates would cheapen their meaning.

The main piece of the Uniform Monday Holiday Act passed in 1968 and officially took effect in 1971 following a presidential executive order. Columbus Day, Memorial Day and Veterans Day were also moved from their traditionally designated dates. (As a result of widespread criticism, in 1980, Veterans' Day was returned to its original November 11 date.)

Did you know? President's Day never falls on the birthday of any U.S. president. Four chief executives—George Washington, William Henry Harrison, Abraham Lincoln and Ronald Reagan — were born in February, but their birthdays all come either too early or late to coincide with Presidents Day, which is always on the third Monday of the month.





WHAT IS A GROUNDHOG?

Size relative to a 6-ft man.

GROUNDHOG: *MARMOTA MONAX;* MAMMALS – HERBIVORES; Head and Body, 17.75 to 24 in;

Tail, 7 to 9.75 in; 13 lbs

The groundhog, or woodchuck, is one of 14 species of marmots. These rodents live a feast-or-famine lifestyle and gorge themselves all summer to build up plentiful reserves

of fat. After the first frost, they retreat to their underground burrows and snooze until spring, drawing their sustenance from body fat. While hibernating, the animal's heart rate plunges, and its body temperature is not much warmer than the temperature inside its burrow.

The groundhog is also referred to as a chuck, wood-shock, groundpig, whistlepig, whistler, thickwood badger, Canada marmot, monax, moonack, weenusk, red monk and, among French Canadians in eastern Canada, siffleux


Groundhog Day and Hibernation

Groundhog hibernation gave rise to the popular American custom of Groundhog Day, held on the second of February every year. Tradition dictates that if a groundhog sees its shadow that day, there will be six more weeks of winter, though such a prediction seems a sure bet over much of the groundhog's North American range. In the spring, females welcome a litter of perhaps a half dozen newborns, which stay with their mother for several months.

Behavior

Groundhogs are the largest members of the squirrel family. Though they are usually seen on the ground, they can climb trees and are also capable swimmers. These rodents frequent the areas where woodlands meet open spaces, like fields, roads, or streams. Here they eat grasses and plants as well as fruits and tree bark. Groundhogs are the bane of many a gardener. They can decimate a plot while voraciously feeding during the summer and fall seasons.





DO YOU, OR SOMEONE YOU KNOW, need assistance with meals - perhaps you are not able to shop for groceries or prepare hot meals. This could be for a nondriver, or someone without a vehicle to drive, or disabled by surgery, injury or disease.

HOW TO CLEAN AND SHARPEN PRUNERS

Clean pruners with warm dish soap and water or spray the blades with Scrubbing Bubbles® bathroom cleaner to remove dried sap. If your pruners have rusted, soak them overnight in white vinegar to dissolve the rust.

- 1. Scrub with a wire brush to remove dirt and rust. Loosen nuts or even disassemble the pruners to clean more thoroughly between the blades.
- 2. Rinse pruners after cleaning off dirt, debris and rust.
- 3. Buff with steel wool to take off any remaining rust or sticky sap.
- 4. Dry with an old towel or sock.
- 5. Sharpen the bevel with a diamond file, following the exact angle of the existing bevel. Run the file from the base to the pointed tip several times.
- 6. Lubricate your pruners with a few drops of oil such as WD-40® or 3-in-1 oil in between all moving parts.

Now they should be clean, sharpened and ready to go!
