

TREAT YOUR PETS LIKE FAMILY

Dogs, cats, rabbits, birds, reptiles, etc. — our pets depend on us for everything: food, shelter, love, medical care, and safety in all cases. Keep those food and water bowls clean. Store pet food safely: If the pet food is moist, refrigerate promptly or discard. Store dry pet food and treats in a cool, dry place (under 80° F). Always wash and dry your pet's food and water dishes before refilling them. Wash your hands before and after handling pet food and feeding your pets.

Here in the Park, pets shouldn't be out overnight or when left alone, but even when you are home and a pet is in the yard, that pet needs shelter from both the sun and inclement weather. Provide a porch or outdoor shelter for your pet. Inside, make sure your pet has a bed that makes the pet feel secure. Don't let anyone, including children, annoy, injure, scare, or otherwise be mean or cruel to the pet. This will also protect someone from being injured by the pet because it is protecting itself.

Love the pet; don't isolate and ignore it. Learn your pet's preferences for grooming, cuddling, being with you, etc. Learn how to use the right equipment, such as brushes, clippers, etc.

Plan ahead for medical needs and emergencies. Remember shots, dental needs, and the changing requirements of older pets.

Last, but not least, if walking your pet, remember to be a good neighbor. Pets outside need to be on leashes and picked up after.



1. Joleen was asked to place an ad in the next newsletter for a volunteer who would be willing to approach some local businesses to place ads in our newsletter.

2. Joe reminded everyone to speak one at a time, no yelling.

COMMITTEE REPORT: BLOCK CAPTAINS

1. Most disaster packets have been distributed. Joe will contact the block captains who have not yet distributed their blocks' packets to see if they need help. Ellen and Wendy volunteered to help distribute for other blocks if needed.

2. Bonnie is waiting for confirmation regarding having a speaker at the November

meeting related to emergency preparations.

OLD BUSINESS:

1. Transportation: No calls for assistance this month. Rernember, you can contact Ellen if you need help.

2. Hobby Show and Sell/Tell had 8 table-displays. Suggestions were made to increase park awareness of this and other events:

a. Ellen already posts signs on bulletin boards around the park: and puts out a sign near the en-trance to the park.

b. It might help to post a sign in the clubhouse window with large lettering stating "EVERYONE WELCOME" to distinguish a park-wide event (separately) from a private event.

c. Joe volunteered to either (1) price the cost of purchasing a couple of advertising stands, or (2) to build one himself. He will report on this at next meeting.

d. The idea of having another Show and Sell/Tell event was tabled for now.

3. Park street names: more suggestions were submitted and will be compiled for the committee to narrow down to 4 options per street to be presented to management for approval. Once approved, the final options will be voted on at the November 8 meeting. THANK YOU to everyone who took the time to offer their ideas.

NEW BUSINESS:


- 1. Suggestion box item(s) A letter was received from Lucy thanking the KLCC for all the work we have been doing. [Editorial comment: It would be great for others who are home and mobile on meeting days to get involved, as even more could be done to bring us together as a community.] Lucy also said the last Connector was the best newsletter so far, especially the Burma Shave reminder that elicited fond memories.
- 2. New member John had several suggestions:


a. He wondered if the Park could publish a list of important numbers and nearby services. He provided an example. No motion was made. Tabled for now.

b. He indicated that the latch for pool access is too high for people with disabilities. Joe will bring this to the attention of the park managers.

c. He indicated that the number of cracks and uneven asphalt in the park may make it unsafe to walk, especially at night.

KLCC MEETING of 1 OCT 2012 - Continued

[Editorial comment: Dark streets would be a good reason to carry a flashlight when walking in the park after dark. Another reason would be that drivers could see you more readily.]

- 1. Other discussion items included:
 - a. Concerns about a couple of motorcyclists speeding down the street with spaces 1-33 and 74-97 (soon to have a real name attached to it!) Board members reminded residents that the best solution is to take down license numbers and report those to the managers of the park.
 - b. Concern about water pressure was raised. Only a couple of residents at the meeting, who live several streets apart from each other, were affected. If the problem persists, the best solution is to report it in writing to the park managers.
 - c. A question about whether or not the board receives any accounting of revenue/expense related to space rents was raised again. The board reminded residents that residents only own their homes, not the land the homes sit on, and the KL is a business that has no obligation to report revenue/expenses to residents.
- 2. Raffle drawing was held for the \$15 that was collected. The winner's name will not be published.
- 3. Next meeting is November 8, 2010. There will be a potluck from 6:30-7:00 PM, and the meeting runs from 7:00-8:00 PM. [NOTE: A potluck is held every odd month at 6:30 pm.]
- 4. TWO AGENDA ITEMS:
 - a. Voting on street names
 - b. There may be a speaker about emergency preparedness waiting for confirmation.


