and three grandchildren. She was 85.

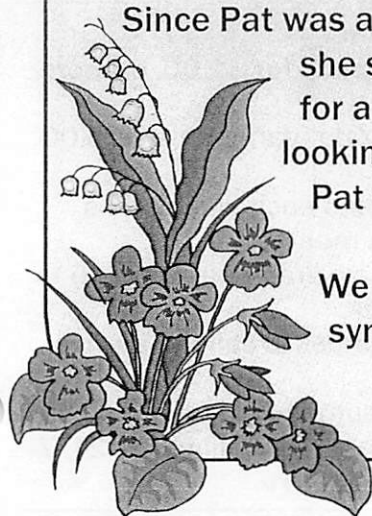
Pat lived in Kearney Lodge for 27 years.

looking after their animals.

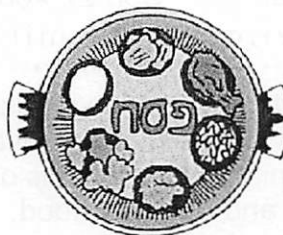
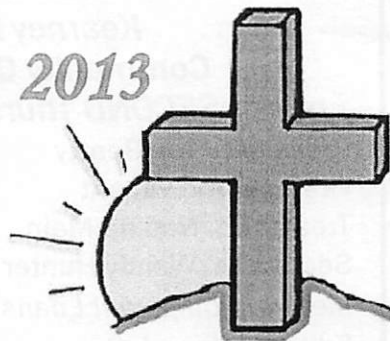

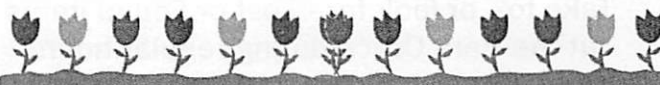

- Bingo games will resume when enough residents verify their interest by calling me 24/7 at 858-525-2282. *Ellen*

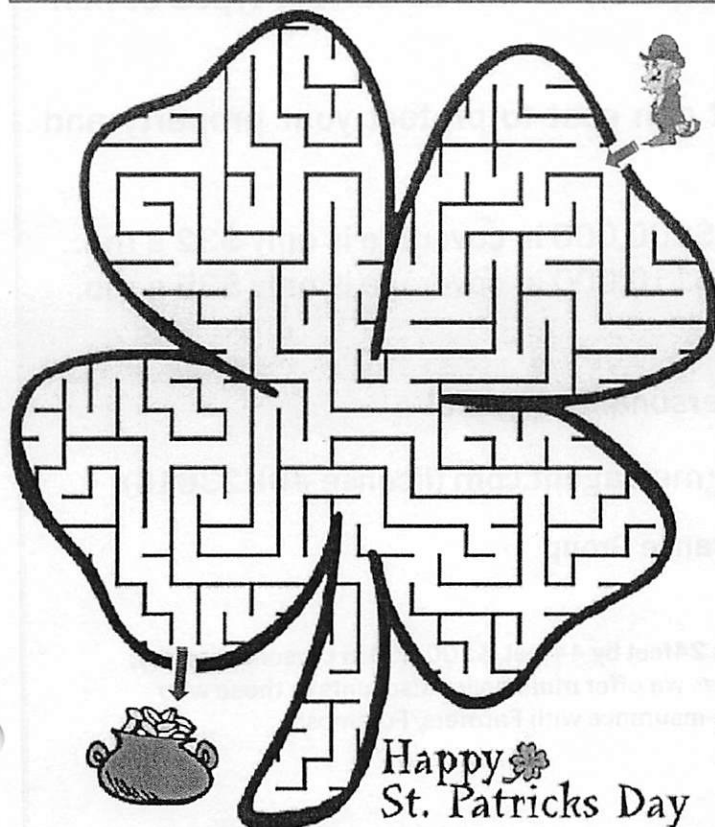

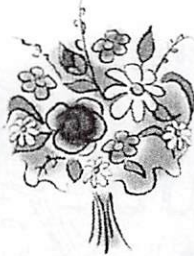

 - b. Suggestions for other residents to approach: Arby's, Tea & More, Starbucks, anything in McGrath Center; your own dentist, hair salon, favorite eating places, gas stations.
 - c. A BIG SHOUT OUT TO ELLEN! "YOU GO GIRL!"
2. Transportation requests are coming in more often: volunteers provided 3 trips to the grocery store, 2 trips to pick up prescriptions, 2 trips to the hair salon, and a trip to pick up lunch for a housebound resident. ANOTHER SHOUT OUT TO THESE VOLUNTEERS!
3. Emergency preparedness — Bonnie was not present at the meeting, but she reported a few days after the meeting that the gentleman she approached has prepared a flyer and will probably choose to present his information at the April or May meeting. 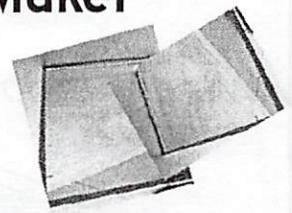

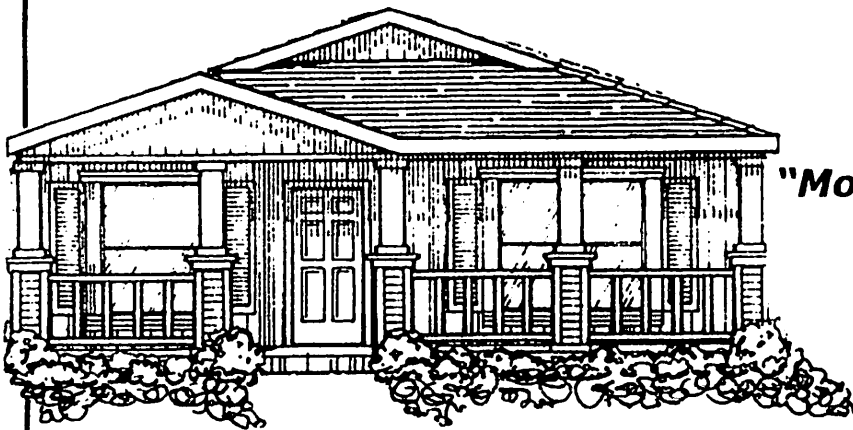

OLD BUSINESS Continued

4. Parking spaces

- There are more RVs parking in the RV lot so those spaces are not available for overflow auto-parking. There is a fee for parking an RV in that lot.
- There is an additional paid parking lot, but it is full and there is a wait-list.
- The back laundry room already has 2 designated spaces — residents are asked to report to management when a vehicle is parked there “illegally.” There are complaint forms available in the clubhouse (near the suggestion mailbox.)
- Joe made a reminder for residents to be courteous to each other because “This is where we live.”

5. Empty home spaces — the Park managers started trimming some trees in the Park and will check on empty spaces. One resident reported he had complained to the managers 3 times with no results, and was told the Park planned to put in a new coach.

6. Street lights—the Park managers agreed to check the existing lights to make sure they are working and providing enough light. They also stated that when they have put in new lights in the past residents nearby have complained about too much light in their bedrooms. This is apparently a complaint from residents who have neighbors who leave their porch lights on all night. One resident at this meeting reported that she had noticed the lights up front coming on at 4 pm and going off at 7:30 pm, which seems like a poor use of lighting. Joe will report to managers so they can check the timers.

7. Restroom at back pool/laundry room — There are no heater vents in that restroom so the warmth in that restroom is a mystery. The managers will continue to research.

8. Shuffleboard — 1 manager wants to take it out and plant grass; the other wants to keep the shuffleboard. Joleen will put a “ballot” in the next newsletter asking residents to voice their opinion regarding which they want. Opinions can be placed in the suggestion box in the clubhouse.

9. Bingo update — one new resident (a couple) said they would be interested in seeing Bingo resumed. Joleen will add this as a question on the “ballot” in the next newsletter.

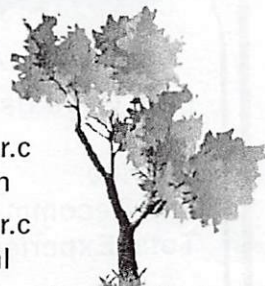

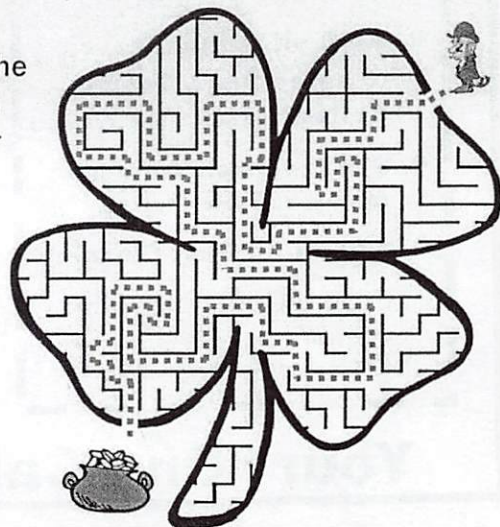

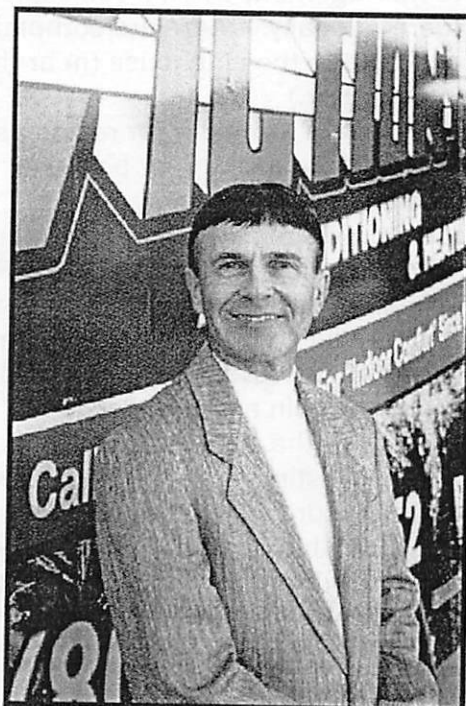

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KLCC MEETING of 14 FEB 2013

NEW BUSINESS:

1. Suggestion box items — none this month
2. There were some reports of a birth and a couple deaths in the Park. Names and information will not be published without permission from the families involved.
3. Joe reminded residents that batteries and light bulbs should NOT be put into the recycling bins. He will ask the Park managers if they can place a battery-recycling box in a public place so residents do not discard these in the trash.
4. Joe reported a potential problem with meter reading — if your dog is outside when the meter readers come by, they will not read the meter. Instead, they will estimate your usage based on past usage. This COULD (and has) resulted in a later bill being increased if their estimate was lower than actual usage. Since you have used the energy, you will be responsible for paying the amount indicated on the bill. Recommendation: keep your dog(s) indoors when meters are being read. Ask the front office when to expect a meter reader to come around to your street.
5. One resident reported she had been asked about a new rummage sale date. None has been set yet; suggestions were for April or May. There was speculation that the Park was planning a dumpster day in April. Joe will ask for a specific date for this and those present thought it might be good to have the Rummage Sale first, so unwanted leftovers can go into the dumpster at the later date.
6. Raffle drawing was held for the \$13.00 that was collected. Winner's name will not be published.

Meeting was ended at 7:35 PM.

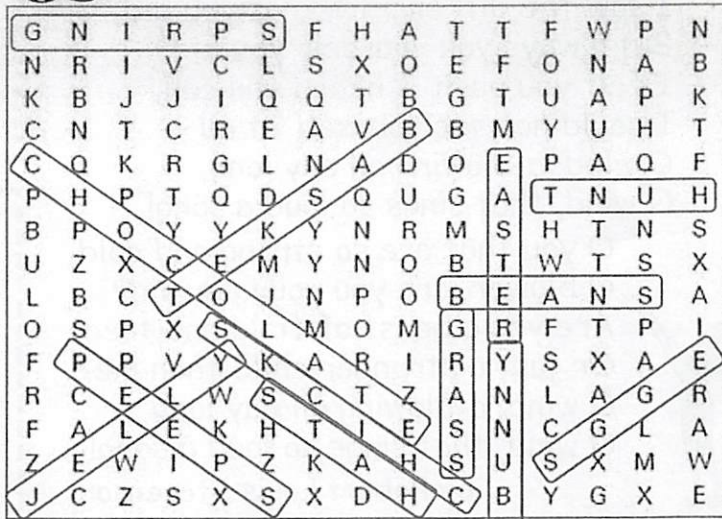

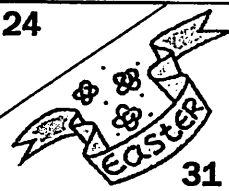
