No known lipogram omits all six most popular symbols. It's also tough to remove "S" (for plurals), "R" (for comparisons) and "D" (for conclusions of past actions).





MAKE A CHINESE LANTERN

Fold a 9 x 12 sheet of construction paper in half lengthwise (plain or decorated.) Leaving a one inch margin on all sides, cut straight lines about a half-inch apart from the fold to the opposite side (see illustration.) Open the paper. Shape it into a tall cylinder with the cuts vertical (see illustration.) Attach a strip of red construction paper to both ends at the top to make a handle. Staple or glue the cylinder together. Hang red or yellow construction paper strips at the bottom of the cylinder. These strips may be curled, accordion-folded, or left plain. Hang your lantern in a safe location.
